

Rochester KC Unit Leads In Auriesville Pilgrims

The largest delegation of 500 persons, who joined the New York State Knights of Columbus pilgrimage to the North American Martyrs Shrine at Auriesville, Sunday was from Rochester.

Sermon at the Martyr Shrine shrine was delivered by His Excellency Bishop Kearney who spoke on the symbolism of the True Cross, the Feast of which was being observed. The Bishop recounted the trials and hardships of the Jesuit saints who had followed the Cross to the New World among the Indians of the area. He called upon the pilgrims to emulate the saints' example.

The Rochester delegation was joined by 25 from Lyons and Champlain, was represented at the Shrine. The New York Central train carrying the biggest delegation out of Rochester was made up of 12 coaches and had 540 aboard. Buffalo's delegation was 171.

When 800 persons at the Shrine, the Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Magr. John J. O'Donnell, F.A., K. of C. state chaplain. Present also was the Rev. John B. Affleck, O.P. of New York, newly named chaplain of the Third Order of St. Dominic, Rochester unit.

Pilgrims were blessed with a relic of the True Cross on completing the outdoor stations. Until around Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus numbering 130 furnished the escort to the Shrine and the social party.

Largely responsible for the top turnout at the pilgrimage was Charles A. Tucker, faithful navigator of Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly and general chairman. Attending also were District Deputy John J. Kinney and Grand Knight George J. Vink, Jr.

Abbot Urges Sainthood For Fred. Kenkel

St. Louis, Mo. (NC) — Delegates to the 77th annual meeting of the Catholic Central Verein of America were urged here to work for the canonization of Frederick P. Kenkel, outstanding Catholic layman, who died last February at the age of 82.

A PAPAL NICHILIST of St. Gregory and Knight of the Holy Sepulchre, Mr. Kenkel was the founder of the Central Verein, national headquarters of the Verein and of the National Catholic Women's Union, which also held its annual convention here. He served as director of the Central Verein for 45 years.

His suggestion that Mr. Kenkel be considered for sainthood came from Abbot Ignatius Egan, C.S.B., of St. Meinrad's Monastery, St. Meinrad, Ind., in the course of a sermon during the 77th annual meeting of the Central Verein. The Mass was celebrated by Archbishop Joseph E. Ritter of St. Louis.

"IF YOU DO your duty to Mr. Kenkel as one of the greatest heroes the holy in our country, he will one day be canonized a saint of the Church. Pray that God may grant that. With that, the honor and glory of your organization will be secured and blessed."

Born in Chicago on October 24, 1869, Mr. Kenkel also founded St. Meinrad's Day Nursery in 1915, located in St. Louis, one of the largest institutions of its kind in this part of the country.

Known internationally for his writings on social subjects, he was regarded as an outstanding Catholic journalist. From 1906 to 1930 he was managing editor of *Commons*, St. Louis Catholic daily newspaper. He edited the publication *United Frontiers Review* and the *Bulletin*, organ of the CVA and NCCWU, until his death.
