

Jesuits To Name High School For Diocese Founder

"McQuaid High School" has been selected as the name for the new boys high school which the Jesuit Fathers are planning to build in Rochester.

Choice of the name for the new school honors the memory and career of the late Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid, founder of Rochester Diocese and early American pioneer of Catholic education in the United States.

Announcement that the profected school will bear the name McQuaid High School as a living memorial to the revered churchman, educator and civic leader was made jointly by His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Rochester, and the Very Rev. John J. McMahon, S.J., head of the New York Province of the Jesuit


The new school will be erected on one of a number of sites now under consideration in Rochester's East Side area.

FUNDS FOR construction of the new Catholic high school for boys will be sought in the forthcoming \$3,045,000 Bishop's High School Jubilee Fund campaign, which will be conducted throughout the diocese from Oct. 28 to Nov. 11. The Rochester area goal in the ampaign will be a fund of \$1,796,500. Later he attended St. John's College which in 1941 became Fordham University, celebrated Jesuit institution of higher education for men. During his life, time Bishop McQuaid was complimented as "one who helped rock the cradle of the infant' Fordham."

Before coming to Mochester, the former orphan boy rose as a young priest to the post of vicer general of the Diocese of Newark, N. J. and was the founder and provident of Soion Half College, now Seton Half University. He also was the founder of St. Elizabeth's College at Convent Station, N. J.

In assuming his responsibilities as first leader of the Rochester Diocese, Bishop McQuaid immediately projected an uncompromising advocacy of the parochlal school system, which he championed as "Christian free schools for the children of the people," In this connection he insisted that a school be an initial part of each newly-established parish. This led to the development in the young diocese of many combined church and school buildings, which served both functions in an "upstairs and down" ar-


