

Mother and Daughter Beatification Causes Studied In Rome

Rome—(NC)—The Sacred Congregation of Rites is carrying on a simultaneous study of the causes of a mother and daughter for beatification.

They are Sister Celine Borzecka and Sister Hedwig Borzecka, who together founded the Sisters of the Resurrection at the end of the last century.

Sister Celine died in Poland in 1933, outliving her daughter, Sister Hedwig, by slightly over seven years. Sister Hedwig died in Rome at the age of 83. Her mother died at the age of 80.

BORN IN EASTERN Poland in 1833, Sister Celine Cludzinska, Sister Celine was married to Joseph Borzecka at the age of 20. She bore four children. Two died shortly after birth. The other two were Celine, who later married, and Hedwig, who was to join in founding the Sisters of the Resurrection.

A member of a wealthy landowner family, Mrs. Borzecka entertained brilliantly as was the custom of the day. But she also devoted much time to prayer and works of charity. She visited the poor of the neighborhood and attended to their wants in every possible way.

In 1869 her husband suffered a stroke. Mrs. Borzecka then turned all her energies to bringing him back to health or at least easing his pain.

DURING THIS crisis Sister Hedwig, then a girl of six, displayed some of the spirit of self-sacrifice which was so characteristic of her religious life later. She placed her bedding on the floor beside her father's bed and attached a cord to his hand and her own. The mere jerk of her father's hand would immediately bring her to his side.

Despite the best care medical science could then provide, Mr. Borzecka died in 1874. Mrs. Borzecka left Vienna, where she had taken her husband for medical care, and together with her daughters headed for Rome.

She had long felt that she wanted to serve God in a special way and she discovered that way

in the Eternal City. She came under the spiritual direction of the Rev. Peter Serenienko, then superior general of the Resurrection Fathers. He had long been looking for a woman with deep spiritual life to found a community of women as a counterpart of the Fathers of the Resurrection. In Mrs. Borzecka he felt God had sent him such a woman.

The remains of both nuns are now buried under the chapel of the Resurrection convent at Kenty, near Cracow, Poland.

AMONG WOMEN Classroom Etiquette

Several years ago a successful college professor upon retirement

wrote his memoirs. Among the many fine things he recounted in his excellent book was the advice given him as a young teacher by his father, also a college professor.

The older teacher said in effect to his son: "Always consider your classroom as your home. Conduct yourself as a gracious host and you will find that your students will respond and conduct themselves as considerate guests."

THE RETIRED college professor went on to remark that during all the years of his teaching career he had followed this advice and had found that such an attitude on the part of the teacher did much to eliminate the ever present discipline problems of the classroom.

Observation while a student and experience as a teacher have led me to believe that there is a great deal of truth and challenge in the old teacher's advice. The teacher who starts with the assumption that the class is a well-meaning group of individuals generally spends less time in disciplining than the teacher who is always on the outlook for "trouble" and ever ready, so to speak, to lower the boom.

But to carry the thought a bit further, could we not as parents reverse this advice? If we train our children to conduct themselves in the classroom like considerate guests, perhaps the teachers would have an opportunity of becoming gracious hosts?
