WVET To Air ND Games

Games with six of the nation's top sixteen collegiate football teams will be included in the complete 10 game Notre Dame football schedule to be broadcast this year by Station WVET.

Ervin F. Lyke, general manager of WVET, in announcing the completion of negotiations for the Fighting Irish broadcasts, pointed out that the United Press pre-season poll ranks Notre Dame as 8th in the nation, while six of the South Bend's scheduled opponents are rated in the top sixteen.

The Notre Dame schedule starts Saturday, Sept. 27, at Philadelphia's Franklin Field, and runs 10 consecutive Saturdays, with the season's wind-up on Nov. 29, when Southern California visits South Bend.

The broadcasts will be handled by Joe Boland, letterman on Knute Rockne's 1924 national championship Notre Dame squad, whose subsequent career has included coaching at Santa Clara, St. Thomas College and Notre Dame, as well as broadcasts of Chicago Cardinals pro football, Notre Dame, and other college games. Local sponsorship of the Notre Dame broadcasts will be through a group of Rochester auto dealers.

Look and Listen

The National Council of Catholic Women were told this week that they could improve television programs by making surveys and reporting on them.

Martin Work, executive secretary of the National Council of Catholic Women which produces religious TV programs itself, said that if television is going to influence the thinking and conduct of children then it is the duty of women to influence television.

Citing the "phenomenal" interest shown in a survey of parents' opinions of television programs for children made early this summer by a group in Virginia, Mr. Work said that the interest in this survey in a sense was out of all due proportion to its meaning but was nevertheless "the kind of survey the television industry was alert for."

The spokesman said, "I think the more surveys of this kind that we can have throughout the country, the better it will be and the faster television will improve."

As a result of the summer survey sixty programs were given a parental rating on educational, entertainment and moral value and a listing of these programs were distributed by NCCM to all the TV stations in the country and to all the large advertising agencies.

IN A POLL recently conducted by the advertising class of Georgian Court College, Lakewood, N. J., 508 out of 608 persons listed Bishop Fulton J. Sheen as their favorite religious program and an additional 24 selected the Bishop's program along with "The Greatest Story Ever Told," "The Greatest Story," which was chosen tops by another 49 viewers.

The areas canvassed in the poll included the metropolitan New York, Boston, the Camden-Boston-Philadelphia triangle, Pittsburgh and Louisville, Ky. which to our mind might well be a representative cross section of the nation's televiewers.

The compiler of the survey, a reporter for the Catholic News, New York archdiocese newspaper, and broadcaster, is John O'Connor. Currently Mr. O'Connor is a visiting lecturer at Georgian Court College and is a faculty member of St. Peter's College, Jersey City, N. J.

Out of the total of 1,300 persons asked whether they had a favorite religious TV program.

A leaflet distributed by the department of education, National Catholic Welfare Conference, noted that the American Bishops in their statement on "The Child—Citizen of Two Worlds" warned that freedom "derives from the spiritual nature of man and can flourish only when the things of the spirit are held in reverence."

"Our future is lost," the N.C.W.C. department said, "unless we examine carefully the spiritual direction we are giving to our children to prepare them to fulfill their future moral responsibilities to God and to their fellow man."
