Plan To Convert Russia

It seems a most challenging coincidence that on Saturday of this week, the first Saturday of October, on the very eve of the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary, Soviet Russia is about to embark on another of her Five Year Plans.

As we all know, our Blessed Mother, in Her Fatima appearance, specifically spoke of the conversion of Russia. But the conversion of Russia is dependent upon our doing penance and vigorous faithfulness to the Rosary devotion.

Could we not each embark upon our own Plan to convert Russia by our offering of the daily rosary and penance attached to everyday life? These hardships are often in themselves hardly worthy of notice; yet when they are spiritualized and offered as an act of reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary they may become a powerful weapon against the enemies of God and of His Church.

WITH THIS daily broadcast of the Family Rosary for Peace now coming into our homes at 6:45 we mothers should plan our dinners a little earlier, if possible, so that the family will be through in time for the Rosary broadcast.

Our Holy Father in an encyclical epistle issued on September 15 of last year pleaded most eloquently for the spread of the family rosary when in addressing the Bishops of the world he said:

"Through your efforts, the Christian people should be led to understand the dignity, the power, and the excellence of the Rosary."

"But it is above all in the bosom of the family that we desire the custom of the family recitation of the Holy Rosary to be everywhere adopted, religiously preserved, and ever more intimately practiced. In this is a remedy sought for the waning faith of civil life, if the family, the principle and foundation of the human community, is not fastened after the pattern of the Gospel."

"TO UNDERTAKE such a difficult duty, we affirm that the custom of the family recitation of the Holy Rosary is a most efficacious means. What a sweet sight—most pleasing to God—when, at evening, the Christian home rejoices with the frequent repetition of praises in honor of the august Queen of Heaven! Then the Rosary recited in common, assembled before the image of the Virgin, in an admirable union of love, the parents and their children, who come back from their daily work, it unites them closely with those absent and those dead."

It links all more tightly in a sweet bond of love, with the most Holy Virgin, who, like a loving mother, in the circle of her children, will be there bestowing upon them an abundance of the gifts of concord and family peace."

If we dedicate our family prayers recited together in an atmosphere of heavenly beloved concord and family peace, surely our Rosary plan for the conversion of Russia would be better than any godless Five Year Plan.
