Catholic News For German Press Planned By Visitor

A Catholic news service to service German Catholic weeklies and the secular press in West Germany is in the process of formation, a distinguished newsmen from Germany said this week in the Courier Journal office.

Dr. Karl A. Bringsmann, editor and political writer of Rheinische Post, publisher of the Christian Democrat in the West, assigned to head the news service. The paper he is associated with has a circulation of 250,000 in Düsseldorf, Germany.

After conferring with the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, editor, and other Courier Journal staff members, Dr. Bringsmann was taken on a tour of the Courier Journal printing plant where the diocesan newspaper is printed.

It is planned to start the National Catholic News Agency in West Germany on Jan. 1 with the chief editorial office to be established in Bonn. Other editorial offices will be set up in Munich, Hamburg and Berlin.

The agency will provide its clients with German Catholic news and Catholic news from all parts of the world.

Dr. Bringsmann is vice president of the Association of German Catholic Publishers and vice president of the International Federation of Catholic Journals.

It is with a group of West German publishers and vice presidents of the United States to adapt to their business needs.

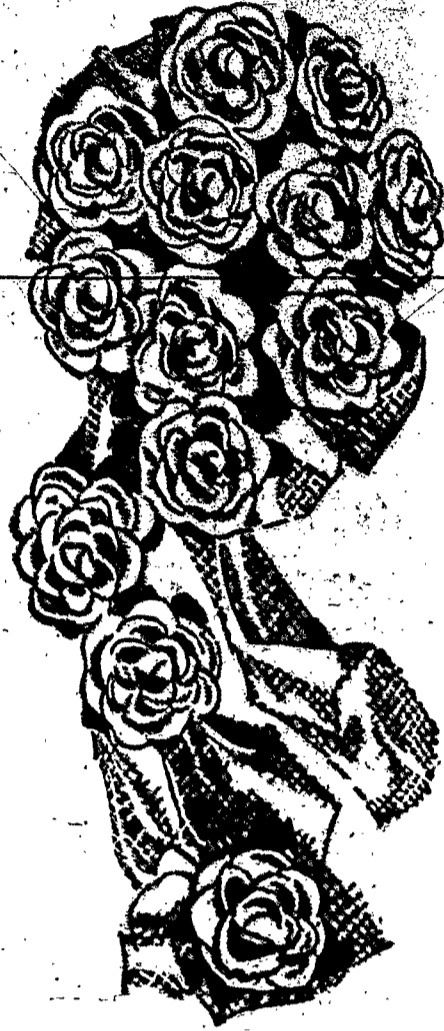
Barry Honored In Philly Rite
