Pope Sees Yugoslav Charge D'Affaires

Castel Gandolfo, Italy—(RNS)—Pope Pius XII received in private audience at his summer residence here Msgr. Silvio Oddi, charge d'affaires at the Papal nunciature in Belgrade, Yugoslavia. Msgr. Oddi was named acting head of the Belgrade nunciature in December, 1950, in the absence of Archbishop Joseph F. Hurley, Bishop of St. Augustine, Fla., who is regent of the nunciature. The visit of Msgr. Oddi came at a time when Yugoslav Communist authorities are reported to be stepping up attacks on Catholic leaders and promoting the formation of pro-government associations of priests.

Too many physicians, she said, perform such operations to cater to the patient's wishes rather than the medical needs of the body. Functional disorders are largely related to the state of mind.

"WHENEVER POSSIBLE, in pelvic operations," said Dr. Irene A. Kossick of the Hertzler Clinic, Haledale, Kans., "the surgeon should retain as much of the sex processes as he can. In this way only is the nervous balance of the patient maintained and fertility retained."

A surgeon who needlessly removes a woman's sex organs, Dr. Kossick continued, not only should have to treat that woman's complaints for the rest of her life, but "he should have to live with her for the rest of her life."

Vatican Radio Hits Red Appointment

London—(RNS)—The Vatican Radio said that the appointment of a collaborationist Hungarian as Canon of the Chapter of the Archdiocese of Esztergom was "null and void."

Appointment of the Rev. Richard Horvath had been reported in Magyar Kurir, Hungarian newspaper, the Vatican station said. It added that the appointment "has no legal effect whatsoever."

Father Horvath is a leader of the "patriotic priests" movement sponsored by the Hungarian Communist regime. His political activities have been denounced several times by the Vatican Radio.

Peruvians Start Decency Legion

Cuzco, Peru—(NC)—Plans have been announced here for a Legion of Decency to combat the sporadic circulation of pornographic magazines. It will be headed by Senor Isabel de Larrazolo, wife of the prefect of Cuzco Province.

Catholic leaders, led by Arch Bishop Felipe Hernandez of Cuzco, were reported to be hopeful that the Legion might also make a contribution toward improvement of the moral tone of theatrical presentations.

Church Relief Aides Tell Refugee Needs

Pusan, Korea—(NC)—Hundreds of thousands of Korean refugees face bitter winter without sufficient food, clothing and shelter. This sums up evidence gathered by

Magr. Edward E. Swanson, director of War Relief Services—National Catholic Welfare Conference, during a six-day tour of on-the-spot observation and conferences in key Korean areas.

"There's going to be a great deal of privation and suffering in Korea this winter," said Monsignor Swanson here, concluding his tour, which included Pusan, Taegu, Seoul and Chunchon.

voluntary agencies now operating in Korea we will have an excellent opportunity to cooperate with UNKRA in relief activities." (UNKRA is the U. N. Korean Reconstruction Agency.)

Monsignor Swanson expressed the hope that "UNKRA will be given an opportunity to begin implementing its program now."

These old weather has already begun in Korea. "Many thousands still have inadequate shelter," said Monsignor Swanson. "Some are stepping out of doors."

Last year, through War Relief Services—N.C.W.C., the Catholics of the U. S. sent large quantities of clothing to Korea. "We've been told that the clothing was sent last winter was of tremendous help in minimizing the suffering here," Monsignor Swanson stated. "We're very anxious to send in as much as we possibly can this year."
