Increasing numbers in our high schools do not permit for the complete education which a Catholic education must impress on young souls. The Bishop quoted his Eminence Cardinal Spellman: "I cannot tell boys and girls, five or ten years from now that it cost too much to help them save their souls."

"By a happy coincidence, he Society of Jesus is coming into the Diocese to open a high school for us at the time that the church dedicated to the Sacred Heart becomes a Cathedral."

The Bishop said that the Jesuits are great apostles of devotion of the Sacred Heart. "I have through the years been very close to the Society. I have always had intense admiration for them."

In the project of supporting Christian education facing the parish, the Bishop said: "We are faced with a great responsibility. It may be different from a responsibility, it may be an oppor-

... tunity, a privilege and may result in a blessing. If so, it is something worth paying for."

"step-by-step" features demanded in homes today.

The Housekeeper's Suite is also located on first floor. The ample closets and storage rooms throughout the house assure the Sisters of a "place for everything."

THE KITCHEN will be equipped with modern built-in cabinets, stainless steel work tables, and the necessary Cooking, Refrigeration and Storage facilities for a family of twenty-five or more.

Individual Bed Rooms, located on second and third floors, are each equipped with washing facilities, and a built-in wardrobe. In addition to the usual furnishings, The groups of bathing and toilet facilities on each floor are arranged for convenient access.

A central Sitting Room and Sewing space is located on the second floor with ample linen and blanket storage cabinets adjacent, also cedar closets for storage of woollens.

THE INFIRMARY Suite has its own toilet facilities, Nurses' Cabinet, etc. The Sun-Porch at Southwest corner on each floor will be built with enclosures for all-season use.

The Laundry installation in Basement will contain the modern type of washing, drying and ironing equipment. The Trunk Room will be of ample size to provide one tier access to all trunks. The Basement will also contain the usual heater and general storage rooms.

THE MAJIN feature of the Basement will be a large Recreational layout consisting of a Central Sitting and Reading Room, Craft Room, Game Rooms, etc.

The large yard space in the rear will be converted into a natural cloister with outdoor shrine and garden. The side and front yard areas will also be fully landscaped as shown on the Architect's rendering.

The Architectural and Engineering firm of Edward M. Lorschelder and Donald M. Walker Associated are now engaged in preparing final plans for bidding. It is anticipated that actual construction will commence on or about March 15, 1953.

### Bishop Presides At Masiello Rites

Funeral services for Dr. Frank J. Masiello, a past officer in the Knights of Columbus, were conducted Tuesday, Oct. 7, in the John M. Hedges Funeral Home, Empire Blvd., and in Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Dr. Masiello, a dentist in Rochester for 20 years, died Saturday, Oct. 4, at the age of 46. He lived at 73 Continental Dr.

A veteran of World War 2, he was a member of the Strablan-Klein Post, American Legion, and past faithful navigator, Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, K. of C., and was active in Rochester Council, K. C. He was also a member of the Order of Alhambra.

Celebrant of the Requiem Mass was the Rev. Raymond E. Moore, assisted by the Rev. John S. Hayes, deacon, and the Rev. Francis W. Luddy, sub-deacon. His Excellency Bishop Kearney presided and the Very Rev. Magr. John E. Marney, the Rev. William O'Brien and the Rev. Richard T. Torney were present in the Sanctuary.

Dr. Masiello came to Rochester from Toronto, Canada, around 1930 and worked at Eastman Dental Dispensary and later had offices in the Sibley Tower Building. For the last several years, his office was located at 370 Genesee St.

Surviving are his wife, Pearl; two daughters, Mrs. Nick Volpe, and Miss Helen Ann Masiello; a son, Paul; his mother, Mrs. Rozina Martello, and three brothers, Gaetano, Samuel and Carmine Masiello. Interment was in Toronto.
