Proceeds are used to help foreign and domestic missions. The dance will take place in the college gymnasium from 9 until 12.

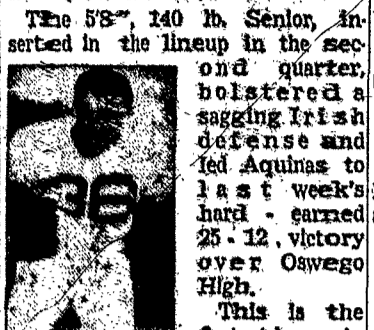
Purpose of the activities, according to co-chairmen Pauline Monsour and Dolores Kokot, is to enable each student to meet each other.

### 8 Scholarships At \$1600 Each Offered By State KC

New York State Knights of Columbus are continuing to offer eight scholarships—five for boys and three for girls—valued at \$1600 each, according to District Deputy John J. Kinney of Rochester.

One of these scholarships was won last year by Miss Mary Lynn McDowan of Rochester who selected Nazareth College.

AWARDS WILL be made as the result of a series of two competitive examinations. The first will be conducted on Saturday morning, Jan. 3, 1953, under direct auspices of the Knights of Columbus, to determine the top three candidates from each of the eight scholarship districts.

These 24 students will then take the College Entrance Examination Board examination on March 14, 1953, in order to select the eight winners.

A candidate, to be eligible for the preliminary examination, must be a Catholic, reside in New York State and expect to graduate from a recognized four year Catholic or Public High School in either January or June, 1953.

APPLICATIONS which will not be acceptable after Dec. 1, 1952, should be filed as soon as possible with the State Chairman of the Scholarship Committee.
