**Catholic Education Aims On 3 Levels  
Explained At St. Augustine's Forum**

"Why Catholic education?" was the timely and interesting question offered three eminent speakers at the Catholic Education Forum held in St. Augustine's Hall, Tuesday evening, Oct. 7.

Gerald R. Barrett, attorney, proposed the question, in his capacity as moderator, to Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles J. Mahoney, superintendent of schools for the diocese, Very Rev. John H. O'Loane, C.S.B., principal of Aquinas, and Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher College.

BEGINNING HIS talk, Monsignor Mahoney remarked that there were 3,000,000 Catholic school children in the U. S., a fact which accounted for a \$400,000,000 saving on the part of the taxpayers. This coupled with the fact that there are 27 Catholic institutions of higher learning in N. Y. state alone, bespeaks a marvelous act of faith on the

part of Catholics, the Monsignor said.

The increase in number of students, the Monsignor stated, necessitate a reorganization in the school system as originally found in the Catholic educational set-up.

All students cannot be subjected to the same curriculum, which at one time had as its sole aim training for the professions.

The plan of education, the Monsignor said, is to develop a social-minded individual, a personality able to take his place in the home, the school, the parish and the community. Religion should be the core of this integrated program.

In summing up, Monsignor Mahoney remarked that education demands more complete common learning and limited specialization. It must utilize the principle of self-activity more fully.

"THE CHILD must be a doer not merely a receiver," Monsignor said.

Father O'Loane, speaking second on the program, traced the changes in secondary education since the time of World War I. The necessity of a high school education since this time has increased, compulsory laws have been passed.

Before the first Great War, Father stated, Catholic high schools were highly selective. It was necessary to broaden out and this presented great economic problems.

The enlarging of a curriculum, too, caused an upset. The newer subjects were hard to teach, Father said, using Civics as an example, where the factual aspect was replaced by an attempt to develop attitudes. There was a great difficulty in making subject matter objective.

In closing, Father O'Loane, as principal of a high school, remarked on how important the adolescent or high school period is. It is a marvelous experience," he said, "to watch the growth of boys to young men in four years."

THAT THE COLLEGE degree of itself "makes for the full life" or is an insurance that the recipient "won't have to get his hands dirty" is the common and completely erroneous opinion of many, stated Father Murphy, president of St. John Fisher's. The life of study is a hard life, Father said, and the teacher's job is equally difficult. It is the
