### College President's Dedication Address

Here is the text of the dedication address delivered by the Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher College, at dedication and consecration taking place for the new institution on Sunday, October 12, 1952.

Written here before you is an idea—An idea that has been whispered into stone—A vision that has blossomed into reality. It has been blessed and dedicated today for a specific purpose—As a Citadel of Truth, As a new fortress of learning dotting the centuries, ready to assume its role as a custodian of the culture of the ages—Ready to assume its role as a beacon for men's needs in these turbulent years of the mid-20th century.

WE ARE POISED on a perfect vantage point to see the meaning and the spirit that must pervade this college—These may be symbolized by—A corner stone and a cross.

The corner stone that was blessed a few minutes ago is a block of Vermont Granite, several million years old. In Roman numerals the date "1950" is carved. That was a Holy Year when the building was started. Engraved around a cross is the Greek motto "Victory in Jesus Christ." On that foundation the spiritual, scientific and cultural life of the college rests.

INScribed in lasting granite, that motto will endure for centuries in granite. It must be written in human hearts as well if St. John Fisher College is to fulfill its sacred mission.

All learning, all personal development is meaningless and dangerous if carried on in a Godless atmosphere. Man needs religion with its personal God—A Father and Redeemer; its divine sympathies and love; its rewards and punishments; its warnings and encouragements, its inspiration and direction.

Religion is not a sort of plous embroidery thrown over a curriculum. It is a life-giving force. It brings the floodlight of faith not merely the candlelight of reason into play to guide men's minds and hearts. It brings KNOW WHY, not just KNOW HOW. It brings Victory in Jesus Christ.

NOT ONLY MEN, but nations must love according to eternal principles if they are to endure. No liberal state can continue to exist in a moral vacuum. 450 years ago today Columbus reached America and kissed the ground of this cradle of liberty.

And today, there are those who would crush these liberties—Not only the restless monster of Atheistic Communism, but the equally dangerous men who would stamp out the private religious school and college as being un-American.

Yet it would seem so normal and natural that private enterprise should produce the private school.

The Catholic college is not a divisive, but a unifying agency. Like the Church, its mission is to all men, for it recognizes the essential dignity of man.

DRAWING ON THE rich stream of our Christian heritage, St. John Fisher College faces a prayerful and hopeful future. We are humble in the noble name we bear. We are eager to kindle a new lamp of learning. Under the mantle of Mary, we trust in the guiding Providence of God.

And etched in indelible memory, will remain this day of October splendor you and a golden cross uplifted against an autumn sky.

BISHOP KEARNEY also commended the priests and architects who planned and directed the erection of the college. The future of the college, he said, is guaranteed by the Basilian Fathers who represent "an endowment in spiritual and intellectual power."

The Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher, hailed the new college as "a Citadel of Truth" and "a fortress of learning." "Here on this foundation," he predicted, "we shall win victories for Jesus Christ, and these victories must be written in human hearts."

In another address, the Very Rev. Edmund J. McCormick, C.S.B., superior general of the Basilian Fathers, expressed gratitude to Bishop Kearney for giving the Basilians the opportunity to serve the Rochester diocese through St. John Fisher College.

FREDERICK M. TORIN, member of the college's Board of Advisory Regents, spoke in behalf of the community. The support of schools in which Christian principles are taught is the best way to support the American way of life, he said. He also made a bid for the aid of private enterprise in helping the college expand and develop its building program.

Joseph J. Myler, chairman of the day's events, introduced the speakers.

AMONG THE many dignitaries present were Bishop Charles E. Nelligan of the staff of Assumption College, Windsor, Ontario; U. S. Representative Kenneth B. Keating, State Senator Frank E. Van Lare, Mayor Samuel B. Dicker, Mrs. Frank Gannett, member of the State Board of Regents.

Members of the College Board of Advisory Regents accompanied by their wives were also in attendance.

During the ceremony of blessing the interior and exterior of the building, the St. Bernard's Seminary Choir, under the direction of Rev. Charles J. McCarthy, intoned the Te Deum. Site of the new collegiate Gothic style building, first of a number planned by the college, is a 72-acre tract on the outskirts of the city. Features of the new building are a 175-foot tower surmounted by a golden cross and a seven-arch loggia. Opened in September, 1951, St. John Fisher College now has a student body of 220 representing only the freshman and sophomore classes.

An expert at understanding and correcting the personal problems of the men, Father Ward handled every man's problem individually, which is a

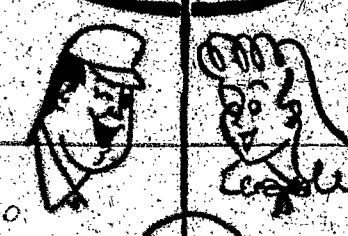
