4,103 Memberships Send CYA Workers Well Over Top

Columbus Youth Association campaigners this week sent their 21st annual membership drive over the top by a wide margin.

At a final report dinner in the ballroom of the Columbus Civic Center Tuesday night, the workers tallied up 4,103 memberships for 164 percent of their 2,500 quota.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney extended his congratulations and thanked the workers in behalf of "those whose lives will be made a little happier." He added that "The CYA furnishes young people the chance for supervised recreation and provides the opportunity to talk to young people about God and their souls."

OF THE 4,103 campaign total, 1,553 memberships came from the Women's Division under the direction of Mrs. Ronald McDonald while John V. Gabel's Men's Division totaled 1,285 memberships. The remaining 1,265 were turned in by the Special Citizens' Committee headed by Harold J. Coleman.

By reporting 294 memberships, the division led by Philip DiPasquale topped the Men's Division with 260 percent of quota while Mrs. DeWain Feller's division was high for the women with 428 memberships for 221 percent of quota.

Other divisions finished as follows: John A. Dale's, 419 members for 169 percent; Francis X. Donovan's, 238 members for 110 percent; Martin M. Brophy's, 334 members for 131 percent; Miss Anita Marra's, 383 members for 154 percent; Mrs. Peter J. Connelly's, 403 members for 161 percent, and Miss Mary A. McGovern, 334 members for 160 percent.

A NEW RECORD for men's teams in the CYA drive was established by the unit led by Deputy City Assessor Charles Argento which reported 73 memberships for 584 percent of quota. Mrs. Joseph Kaseman held her position as top captain among the women by reporting 183 members for a 453 percentage.

Other top teams were led by John C. Doyle, 75 members, 318 percent; Urban Kress, 192 members, 314 percent; Mrs. Henry J. Kearse, 76 members, 284 percent; Charles Drons, 106 members, 281 percent; Rita Knaufl,
