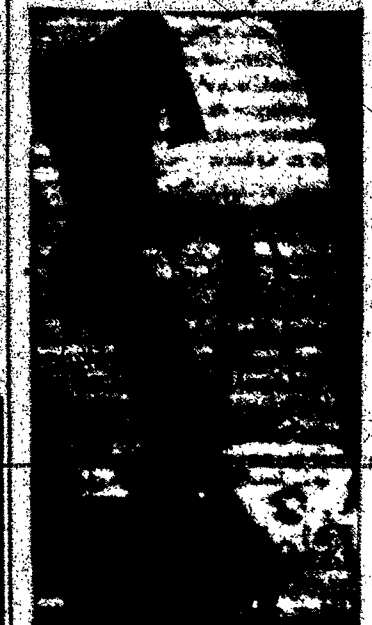


Anna Devereaux Dies At Holy Rosary

Cpl. Culhane, Ex-Aquinas Student Missing In Korea

Cpl. William D. Culhane, 25 Cottage St., was reported missing in action in Korea two days before he was due to start back to the United States for rotation.

According to the Defense Department telegram received by Mrs. Culhane, Cpl. Culhane was reported missing Sept. 29. In his last letter home the soldier wrote that he expected to leave Korea Oct. 1 for Japan on his way back to this country. He wrote that he was looking forward to being home for Christmas.

IN THE Waning months of World War 2, Corporal Culhane joined the Navy but was discharged after 10 months of service because of illness in the family and a heart condition he had. The family reported that he had been tried to enlist in the Army in April 1951 but was rejected because of his heart condition.

Father Malley Of Basilians To Study In Rome

The Rev. Eugene R. Malley, C.S.B., M.A., a native of Rochester, has been sent to Rome for graduate studies in Sacred Theology.

Very Rev. E. J. McCortell, C.S.B., Superior General of the Basilian Fathers announced Father Malley's appointment during his recent visit to Rochester on the occasion of the formal blessing and dedication of St. John Fisher College.

Born and raised in Rochester, Father Malley attended St. Augustine's School and Aquinas Institute.

When he entered the Congregation of St. Basil in Sept. 1942, Father was one of the first group of Basilians to make their novitiate in Rochester.

Father Malley received degrees of Bachelor and Master in Arts from the University of Toronto. He studied Sacred Theology at St. Basil's Seminary in Toronto.

Dr. John Butler, director of medical education at the hospital, outlined the work of interns and resident physicians.
THE SETON WORKERS was organized in 1933 and named for Mother Seton, founder of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, the community of Sisters which staffs St. Mary's.
The group has grown from six to 25 branches and a total of 250 members.
According to Mrs. Frank Toolan, president of the organization, members perform various tasks of sewing, making medical dressings, sometimes outfitting an entire room or ward with drapes, chairs and hospital equipment.
