

Powerful Opponent Seen In Catholic Central Squad

Aquinas dreams of an undefeated season were blasted last Sunday by the talented Archbishop Stepienac team, 20-12. And more Thanksgiving, the Irish must face such formidable opponents as Catholic Central of Detroit, Cathedral Prep of Erie and Boystown.
