AOH To Sponsor Pilgrimage To Rome, France, Ireland

A pilgrimage to Rome, the famed Shrines in Europe and to Ireland under the auspices of the New York State Ancient Order of Hibernians, sailing in August of 1953, was announced today by the Rev. Michael P. O'Brien of Rochester, state chaplain.

The tour in two sections will consist of Pilgrimage A, taking 30 days and Pilgrimage B, of 19 days duration. Father O'Brien will be spiritual director of the pilgrimage.

SAILING ON the United States Lines about August 1, schedules pending, the "A" pilgrimage will visit various countries as follows: France—Paris, Lisieux (Shrine of the Little Flower); Lourdes (Grotto and Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes); Nice, French Riviera.

Italy: Pisa, City of the Leaning Tower; Rome, where a special Audience with the Holy Father will be petitioned for the A.O.H.; Milan; viewing "The Last Supper."

Switzerland: Luzerne, steamer excursion on the Lake of the Four Cantons and ascent of Mt. Pilatus.

England—London, devotions at the Shrine of St. Martin Stock and a visit to the Catholic Westminster Cathedral.
