

### Nazareth Chosen First In State For College Blood-Service Training Plan

Nazareth College was selected as the first college in the state, and probably in the nation, to conduct a trial mass blood-service training program. Sister Rose Angela, dean, and Dr. Herbert R. Brown announced jointly today. Dr. Brown is Regional Blood Service coordinator for the New York State Department of Health office of civilian defense, under

whose auspices the course will be given.

If successful at Nazareth College, Dr. Brown said, the plan will be adopted by other colleges throughout the state to help train women in the techniques of taking, grouping and matching blood from large numbers of donors in time of emergency.

**THIS IS HOW** the training program will work, according to Dr. Arthur J. Redmond, Monroe County coordinator of blood service. A pilot group of from 25 to 50 volunteer students will be given an intensive course of eight one-and-a-half hour periods. They will hear lectures and see demonstrations covering constituents of blood, processing of donors, sterilization and care of equipment and methods of determining hemoglobin.

Students will practice on each other injecting needles into the vein of the arm, withdrawing small amounts of blood, pricking fingers and using the copper sulphate method to determine the specific gravity of blood.

While most of the work will be done in the college laboratory, students will observe the procedure in the Red Cross blood bank. According to Dr. Red-

mond, the trainees will spend more time in this line of work than do medical school students.

**IN ADDITION** to Drs. Brown and Redmond, instructors will be Dr. Milton G. Bohrod and Jacob Adler of General and St. Mary's hospitals, respectively.

Stressing the need for the program, Dr. Brown pointed out that in the event of an atomic attack an estimated 11,700 pints of type O blood would be needed in the Rochester region within 24 hours. Purpose of the state health department's plan is to insure that enough trained personnel are available to conduct the mass donation program to meet this need.

The experimental training program at Nazareth College will be watched carefully by the health department to detect possible flaws, Dr. Redmond said.

Since such a program has never, to his knowledge, been tried before, he said he could not guarantee its success. But he expressed confidence that it would help prepare technicians who will be needed if the day comes when great quantities of blood must be collected and processed in a hurry.
