Mother Of Sorrows School To Rise On Mt. Read Blvd.

The first spadeful of earth was turned last Sunday, Nov. 2, at the site of a new school for Our Mother of Sorrows Parish by the Rev. Daniel B. O'Rourke, pastor. A thousand onlookers were present for the ceremony which began the construction of a \$300,000 school in the Latta Rd. area.

OPENING OF the new building has been set for next September, when about 450 pupils are expected to register. The old school at 4900 Mt. Read Blvd. will be used as a gymnasium.

Designed by Charles A. Ploch of Rochester, the building will be a modern U-shaped structure rising from a single story in front to two stories in the rear. It will be located between the church and present school of Our Mother of Sorrows.

Sister M. Jean Joseph, S.S.J., will be principal of the new school.

Business Gifts To Bishop's Fund Hailed

Generosity of business men in the Bishop's Jubilee High School Fund campaign is hailed in the column, "Sidelights on the News," in Buffalo diocese "Union and Echo," dated Oct. 20, 1952. The column, written by Joseph P. Driscoll, associate editor, appears below:

SIDELIGHTS ON THE NEWS

The Diocese of Rochester is currently seeking \$3,000,000 for its Catholic high school program. The public campaign hasn't started yet but for the past few weeks the special gifts division has been busy and with phenomenal success.

The Catholic Courier Journal reports that a total of \$49,000 was received last week from four large corporations—Hickory-Freeman, \$25,000; James Cunningham Son & Co., \$10,000; Rochester Gas and Electric, \$8,000; and Genesee Brewing, \$6,000. Previously Eastman Kodak had pledged \$85,000; Tobin Packing, \$30,000, and Bausch and Lomb Optical, \$3,000.

We do not recall any such gifts from similar commercial concerns in other cities to a Catholic school drive. Rochester may not be unique but it certainly is outstanding. You could be cynical about it and say that big companies pay high taxes anyway and the gifts won't be as much out of their treasuries as it seems since they are deductible from income taxes. Or you could say that it will save them as much or more in property taxes for
