The theme of the meeting is "The Role of the Christian in the World for Peace."  
 THE FIRST annual C.A.I.P. award will be presented at a banquet Saturday night to an American who has made an outstanding contribution to peace and the furtherance of international justice and charity.

Dr. John C. H. Wu, former Chinese ambassador to the Vatican, and Dr. Charles Fenwick, director of the department of international law, Pan American union will address the banquet. Speakers and panel discussions will be concerned with the problems "Distribution of the World's Resources for All Men" and "Working for Peace in an Armed World."

The conference will apply the Christian principles to such topics as international economic life, technical assistance and foreign aid, food distribution and land reform, and the U. N. as a peace society.

**India Army Chief Taken To Task On Birth Control**

Bombay, India — (NC) — The Examiner, century-old Catholic weekly of this city, has taken to task Gen. K. M. Kariappa, Indian army chief, for his all-out support of birth control.

Speaking to a group of former Indian servicemen at Jubulpore, General Kariappa stated that birth control is a national necessity so that the parents can limit their children to the number they can adequately rear.

The Examiner quoted the Hindu journal, The Harijan, stating that birth control rejects the old idea of self control and substitutes a philosophy which spells moral ruin and could lead to the extinction of the race.
