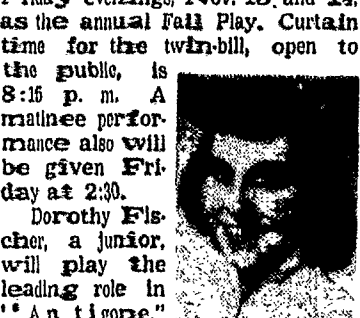

Antigone, heroic daughter of Oedipus, has been called a type of ancient Joan of Arc who rebels against authority she considers unjust. Willing to sacrifice her own life for what she considers right, she performs funeral rites over the body of her brother Polyneices in defiance of an order by her uncle, the king of Thebes. She is dramatically symbolic of the triumph of spiritual over human law.

In decided contrast to the Greek tragedy, written in the fourth century before Christ, is the 17th century comedy by Moliere which lampoons French manners of the period, as the high-brow young ladies and their suitors engage in a whirlwind of deceitful activities to gain their ends.

New York (NC)—A Television Playwriting Contest limited to the students of men's and women's colleges of the Archdiocese of New York has been announced by His Eminence Archbishop Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York. The Cardinal will personally present the awards of \$1,000, \$500 and \$100 Savings Bonds to the three winners. The contest closes January 15, 1953, after which entries will be submitted to a panel of judges including Worthington Miner, NBC-TV producer; James Cadigan, Dumont program producer; Daniel T. O'Shea, CBS vice-president, and Gene Lockhart, noted motion picture, stage and television actor. All rights to the scripts remain with the authors. It is hoped that the contest will afford men and women of Catholic colleges an opportunity to break into this important new field.

Look and Listen

Great ballet tradition was spiced with gentle humor and sparked with modern drama with the appearance of Frederic Franklin and Mla Slavenska on the stage of the Auditorium Theater Monday evening.

Giving a performance that reflected their skill and classic training this duo and their company gave to Rochesterians the accomplished performance of Alexandra Danilova as guest artist.

"SWAN LARK" opening the program was given an excellent interpretation by Madame Danilova in the role of the Swan Queen. Technique was near flawless and the overall portrayal favored the dramatic. Roland Vasquez made a gallant Prince and the Darcos of the Little Swans was clipped and fluid in delightful contrasts. Here we must note that the corps de ballet was consistently disappointing.

This reporter found "A Streetcar Named Desire" lacking in any particular appeal despite excellent performances on the part of Franklin and Slavenska. The dancing tended to the interpretative at the sacrifice of ballet's purpose. Franklin's performance was masterful and reflected the thorough old-school training.

Francis Moore Plays Lead Role In N. Y. City

Francis Moore, a native Rochesterian, has been chosen for the lead role in "The Secret of Mary," a three-act play about the life of St. Louis Mary De Montfort opening Nov. 8 at Nativity Hall in New York City. Mary Eunice Sayrarden, one-time city resident, will direct. Miss Sayrarden, together with her husband, Joseph Spagnola, founded "Mary Productions" in New York, an organization dedicated to the glorification of Mary through the entertainment medium. A graduate of St. Monica's School, Moore attended Aquinas Institute and Niagara University. He served in the Army from 1942 until 1946, after which he studied at the Dramatic Workshop in New York. Moore has been associated with the Pittsford Summer Theater, The Van Wych Players at Beacon, N. Y., and formed the Lakeside Players, a summer stock group which appeared at Webster a few seasons ago.

Beverly Hills, Calif. (NC)—Dixie Lee Crosby, wife of Bing Crosby, was received into the Catholic Church shortly before she died at her home here in ill health for several years. The ceremony after having apparently waited from a major abdominal operation in September. Mrs. Crosby was baptized by Fr. Patrick J. Conannon, pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd in Beverly Hills, the day before she lapsed into a coma. The priest, who had visited the bedside a number of times during Mrs. Crosby's critical illness, subsequently administered the last rites.

At the bedside were Mr. Crosby and the couple's four sons, all of whom are Catholics. The Crosbys were married in 1930. Mrs. Crosby, who adopted the stage name of Dixie Lee, was born Wilma V. Wyatt in Memphis, Tenn.
