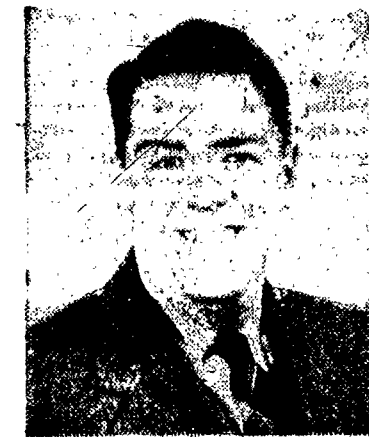


Friday Club To Mark Ten Years

Navy Publication Cites Chaplain, Ex-All American

Chaplain Gervase C. McMillan, O.F.M. of the U. S. Navy whose mother, brother and two sisters reside in Rochester is featured in the New York Navy publication of the Navy Base at Newport.

Fr. McMillan, of the Franciscan Order is instructor at the Chaplain's indoctrination Unit of the U. S. Naval Schools Command. He holds the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

In the Navy publication, the fact that he was a former All-America athlete at St. Bonaventure University is prominently brought out.

At St. Bonaventure he played right guard on the basketball team and left end on the football squad for four years. He was nominated to many All-America teams during his junior and senior years.

Born in Corning he studied at Corning Free Academy and after his course at St. Bonaventure in 1926 entered the Franciscan Monastery in Paterson, N. J. where he was ordained to the priesthood.

Completing his religious training, Chaplain McMillan spent 14 years conducting missions all over the country. He entered the Navy shortly after the outbreak of World War II.

During that war he was served in Australia, the Philippines and Balk Papan, Borneo. He was discharged in 1946 from the Naval Air Station, Whittby Island, Wash.

Returning to St. Bonaventure, Chaplain McMillan served as alumni director until the Korean War began.

Dunn Rolls 598 In Auburn Loop

Auburn — Bill Dunn was in games of 213, 179 and 206 for mid-season form as he rolled a 598 total to lead the St. Alonius Holy Name Bowling League. But despite Dunn's one-man performance he could spark his team to only a point against Notre Dame.

Bernard Osterman with 518 and Freddy Gilbert with 507 led Notre Dame in their three to one victory over Santa Clara and caused a three way tie for second place.

Joe Spoto with 536 was the big gun in Loyola's victory. Nate Navarro rolled a 245 game, the second high single of the season to give him a 552 total and was the chief cause that Canisius split with Gonzaga.

Leo Lavarnway with 516 and Jaul J. Graney with 502 helped out.

Father Haffey with 570 and John Bodnar with 534 helped Gonzaga stay out of last place by a half-point.
