Notre Dame Post Office 100 Years Old

Notre Dame, Ind.- (NC) Now in its second century of operation the Notre Dame post office handles 10,000 pieces of first-class mail and some 600 parcel post packages daily for the 5,100 University of Notre Dame students.

It also handles the large number of publications regu larly issued at the university, the mail of the faculty, football tickets, and variety of other postal matters.

The postmark "Notre Dame, Indiana," resulted from the efforts 100 years ago of Father Edward Sorin, C.S.C., founder and first president of Notre Dame. He sought a post office for the then small school besause he felt, that "the sight of the mail coach sweeping up to the door each day will add

dignity and attract attention to the university." Today the post office employs a stall of eight full-time employces and more than 30 student assistants. It is largely staffed by Brothers of Holy Cross who qualify by passing regular Civil Service examinations.
