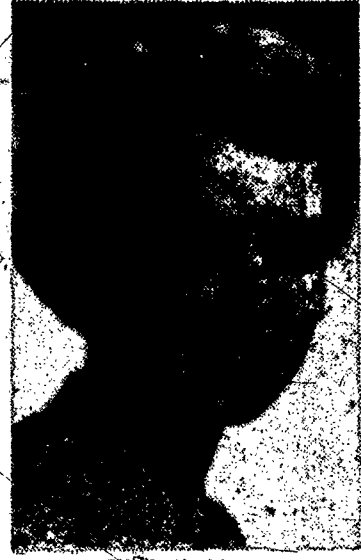


Sidewalks Of New York Musical Set At St. Boniface

On TV, Paul Winchell, onetime polio victim, has put the ancient art of ventriloquism back on its feet. He and his sidekick, Jerry Mahoney, are seen by millions each week. Winchell seems to have developed a brand new technique, a revolution that is slowly but surely getting his dummy under remote control. Jerry can already walk, dance, play drums, smoke a cigarette, type, move his fingers and tongue, and box.

ANOTHER SWITCH of Winchell's is pantomime between dummy and mentor, a complete turnabout for an art form that has always depended on conversation. Even Winchell doesn't know how this is all going to end, but it's terrific entertainment. TUNE IN ON CBS's "Church of the Air" this Sunday. Speaker will be Rev. Raymond P. Cahill, Director of Television Communication of the Archdiocese of Washington, D. C. Notre Dame Academy Glee Club of Washington, under the direction of Sister Gertrude Cecilia, will provide the music. KATHARINE (THE GREAT) Cornell, first lady of the American stage, came to Rochester last week end. Miss Cornell brought with her a top-notch cast, her own supreme abilities and a "thumbs-down" play, "The Constant Wife." If you remember Cornell as Juliet, Elizabeth Barrett and Joan of Arc, you remember the queen of them all. Once more before I die, or she does, I would like to see the great lady do a play worthy of her "once in a hundred years" talent. You'll be seeing "The Hound of Heaven" in the movies before too long. The immortal classic from the pen of English poet, Francis Thompson, has been adapted for motion picture by screenwriter, Fred Niblo, Jr.

Outstanding highlight of the Eastman Theatre season in Rochester will be a star-studded presentation of Stephen Vincent Benet's epic work "John Brown's Body" on Wednesday evening, Dec. 10. TYRONE POWER, Raymond Massey and Judith Anderson head a distinguished troupe of 20 players, supplemented by the Walter Schumann Choral Group. Here is another new and exciting achievement in the theatre—a combination of drama, music, poetry, beauty and artistry. I GUESS IF you're in New York for a week-end, "Dial M For Murder" is the show to see. A real gory thriller, this brand new "who-dun-it" is being rated with the best. Life gave it a picture spread. Wolcott Gibbs, New Yorker critic, thinks it's tops. No small praise from the boy who usually doesn't like anything. A young Rochesterian, Porter Van Zandt, does himself proud in a supporting role.
