### Disney Announces Entry Into Non-Theatrical Field

News long awaited by educational, church, club and other non-theatrical users of 16 millimeter motion pictures, was announced by Roy O. Disney, president of Walt Disney Productions, in a statement closing that Disney will make a number of films available in this field beginning shortly after January 1.

Yielding to steadily increasing demand for pictures from these important sources, Disney will release a varied list of attractions which are both entertaining and educational, with the list headed by "The Alaskan Eskimo", the first Disney film produced exclusively for 16 mm audiences. It also is the initial production in a dramatic new series, "People and Places", which will be filmed the world over.

ALL RELEASES are in color.

ALREADY Disney has licensed 65 distributing units scattered across the country to handle these films, under the direction of Carl Nater, heading the company's Non-Theatrical department.

Four subjects running from 15 minutes to 27 minutes in length, as well as three separate comedy shorts are included in the first list of releases. Others will be added as demands indicate. All will be handled on a flat rental basis.

Besides "The Alaskan Eskimo" which took nine months to film, in the rugged reaches inside the Arctic Circle, the varied list of pictures made available to non-theatrical users include, "History of Aviation", "Behind the Scenes of Walt Disney Studio", Disney Cartoon Parade Number One, and "Clock, Cleaners", "Donald and Pluto" and "Home Trouble", individual shorts.

"THE HISTORY of Aviation", an all cartoon subject running 15 minutes, is a moving story of our pioneer bird men, from the founding, fateful experiments of the Wright Brothers at Kitty Hawk to the dawn of the modern, time-saving airplane. The subject reveals the vital role of aviation in war and peace.

"Behind the Scenes of Walt Disney Studio", takes one on a tour of Disney's fascinating workshop under the humorous guidance of Robert Benchley. Disney and his staff of creative artists show how they give life to the fabulous cartoon characters known and loved the world over.
