**BUSINESS SUBJECTS** will be taught in the new school, the pamphlet states and lists typewriting, bookkeeping, shorthand, office practice, secretarial practice, business mathematics and business law. These will be in addition to a high standard of secondary school subjects.  
 "Students will be trained," the pamphlet states "for the type of office work in which Elmira is interested. Graduates will be dependable, conscientious, self-sacrificing, and will be able to work with others.  
 As an asset the new, high school, to cost more than \$1,300,000, will mean that another public high school will not have to be constructed.

**THE PAMPHLET** further states:  
 "Besides taking the amount of \$1,300,000 from your tax bills, an income tax deductible contribution to this building fund will pay annual dividends to your company in the form of school tax savings each year."  
**PRESENT SAVINGS:**—The 1952-1953 public school appropriation for the City of Elmira is \$2,293,353. Total registration in public schools is 7,727. This figures out to \$296.90 per pupil. There are 2,062 students in parochial schools now operating in Elmira. Applying the cost of \$296.90 means an annual saving of \$611,114 to taxpayers.

**ADDITIONAL SAVINGS DUE TO NEW HIGH SCHOOL:**—The new high school is designed for 700 students. Applying the average cost of \$296.90 per student means an annual saving of \$207,830 to taxpayers.

**SUMMARY OF TAX SAVINGS:**—\$611,114 now saved annually and \$207,830 to be saved totals \$818,944. This means a total annual tax savings of \$15.03 per \$1000 of assessed valuation. Breaking down the \$15.03 rate means \$6.13 per \$1000 of assessed valuation is saved annually from direct school taxes, and \$8.90 from indirect school taxes which you pay in the form of state aid. These savings apply not only to your company, but also the assessed valuation of property in Elmira owned by your employees.

The Elmira solicitation is in addition to the Bishop's Jubilee High School fund campaign conducted successfully in Elmira.

**Belgian Priest Tells Of Torture By Chinese Reds**

Hong Kong—(RNS)—From his sickbed in a Catholic hospital here a Belgian priest described the torture to which he was subjected by Chinese Communists before being expelled from the country.

The priest, Father Joseph Schyns of Brussels, told how his persecutors had ripped off his beard and hung him by his arms until his shoulders were dislocated.

"I tried not to, but I'm afraid I screamed with pain," Father Schyns said.

He said that his arms were chained behind his back and he was placed on a pile of bricks with his chained wrists roped to a spike in the wall.

One by one, the priest related, the bricks were taken from beneath him until he was left suspended with his weight pulling his crossed arms above him.

Father Schyns said that the action forced his arms loose from their sockets. After 17-18 minutes he was taken down and his arm bones roughly snapped back into position.

Communist officials carried out this torture 13 times over a period of months, the priest said, and tried to force him to confess various alleged crimes.
