

## Parents Warned To Check On TV For Children

Parents of Sacred Heart Cathedral parish were warned of dangers in television, the motion pictures and in current reading matter by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Lawrence E. Casey, rector, in sermons at the Cathedral, Sunday.

"Our task," the sermon as printed in part in the parish Bulletin said, "is not to praise the obvious merits of television and its great potential force for good but rather to point out possible dangers to the spiritual and educational life of your children and yourselves."

"SOME OF the current TV programs are definitely bad for children."

"Never has a generation of impressionable youngsters been instructed on the best ways to commit murder, assault and bank robbery as demonstrably as this one has on television."

"If the children stay up late enough, they are exposed to the cheap humor of the slick comedians, certain routines and jokes which should be given a treatment of chloride of lime, the nauseating commercials, the devastating influence of some of the horror stories and the plunging necklines."

"WHY SOME parents take every precaution lest their children meet certain unwholesome characters on the street and then expose these same youngsters to entertainment which can be morally ruinous is one of the unexplained mysteries."

"Parents: Check on the movies and the TV programs your children see. The Lord will call you on this serious obligation when you are judged."

Monsignor Casey noted the investigation on in Washington on obscene literature and further warned the parents to check on what their children read.

## Rededication Slated Sunday For Remodeled St. Charles Church

Rededication of St. Charles Borromeo Church, Maiden Lane and Dewey Ave., Greece, by His Excellency Bishop Kearney will take place Sunday, Dec. 14 at 10 a. m. The Rev. Robert A. Keleher, pastor, announced today.

The Bishop will preside at a Solemn High Mass and will preach the sermon.

CELEBRANT OF the Mass will be Father Keleher assisted by the Rev. Francis M. Feeney, pastor of St. James Church, and a former assistant, as Decora and the Rev. Arthur C. Looby, C.S.B. of Aquinas Institute faculty, as Subdeacon.

The church, built in 1926, has been completely remodeled inside and out. The Sanctuary has been changed from the east to the west end of the church and a new sanctuary arch has been installed.

CEREMONIES Sunday will be conducted at a new altar with a new reredos and screen.

The main vestibule will have three entrances and the new tower rising on the Greece town skyline will house the Baptistry off the vestibule. The two new side vestibules and the main one all have tile roofs.

A new choir loft and organ have been installed. All pews have been completely remodeled. New acoustic ceilings have been installed to eliminate distracting noises. Wrought iron lanterns and all new windows have been installed.

STAINED GLASS windows have been placed in the Sanctuary, choir loft and Baptistry and the priests' vestry has been enlarged.

Seating capacity of St. Charles Borromeo church will be 788 on the main floor and 90 in the choir loft.

All Masses will be celebrated in the remodeled church Sunday, for the first time, Father Keleher said.
