GOD LOVE YOU!

NO PERSON can ever love anything he cannot get his arms around, and the cosmos is too big and too bulky. That is why God if He was to be loved had to make Himself as small as a Babe, When I went to the door I was that we might put our arms around Him in the Crib and our hearts around Him in Holy Communion,

No one can fall in love with a theorem of geometry or a code or commandment. It is even hard to love God as a Supreme Being. It was no wonder then that for centuries people made God into images of stone, and silver, gold and brass. They were almost saying: "The great gods on the Olympian heights are too far removed from the dust of human lives. If He will not come down, then we will make Him come down in our homes as metal and brass and wood. All this was wrong, ... but the subjective state that prompted it was right, namely the desire for a love that takes on human flesh."

That is the meaning of Bethlehem: God taking unto Himself a human nature like ours from His Mother Mary. As there is in us a union of two natures, our body and our soul, and yet we are only one person, so in this Babe, there is a perfect union of the nature of God, but only one Person, the Person of the Son of God who became Man that we might become the sons of God.

Would it be humilisting for us to disposses ourselves of our body and put our soul into that of a dog or a crab? Suppose furthermore that for the life of that animal, we willed never to exceed the limitation of that organism and condemned ourselves to the association with other dogs or crabs, knowing that we were a thousand times more worthy and had immortal souls. But what is that humiliation compared to the Son of God emptying Hinnelf of the glory of His Divinity and taking on the form of a man, and living with unlearned men for thirty-three years? More astounding still is it that God would house Himself for nine months in the fieshy ciborium of a woman-He the Word remaining wordless; Omnipotence in Bonds; Eternity in Time; He the bird that built the nest is being hatched therein.

The humiliation and the goodness of the Incarnation is so everwhelming that the only ones who can really understand it are those who try to humble themselves and sacrifice themselves for the cause of that Divine Babe.

During the past year thousands have denied themselves a luxury, even a necessity that our holy faith might be given to the 1,100,000,000 pagans. To these and to all others, a New Year rich in happiness because rich in sacrifices.
