A letter received from France this week was accompanied by a Parisian theatre periodical which tells in garish headlines of the riots and furor which Jean Paul Sartre's play "Le Diable et le bon Dieu" is causing across France.

On the back page of the same paper, three lines announce that Les Compagnons de Notre Dame has arrived in the little town of St. Jean de Losne.

THE GREAT VENTURE OF Henri Ghéon, one of France's foremost literary figures of this century, was to introduce the saints to the modern world through the medium of the drama.

MISPLAYS, modeled on the mediaeval mystery and miracle plays, are strikingly modern in characterization and their relation to current problems.

HE ALWAYS BELIEVED that the theater had a social and moral responsibility. Because he had a very sensitive artistic conscience, he did not believe, however, that any amount of pious and good intentions could make up for poor writing.

GHEON FELT that it was his first duty as a dramatist to write plays which would act well and entertain the public. If they also taught moral lessons and helped to strengthen people's faith, well and good.

Ancient Jericho, Biblical Town, Goes Modern

Amman, Jordan (NC)—Probably not since the reign of King Herod the Great has the ancient town of Jericho undergone such modernization.

In what has been a sleepy Oriental village for many years, sidewalks are now being laid over former dusty thoroughfares, the streets widened and paved, and electric street lighting installed amid fringed palm trees and fragrant orange groves.

PERHAPS THE MOST important among the improvements is the building of a paved road from Jericho to the traditional place of Christ's baptism on the banks of the Jordan River, some five miles east of the town itself.

THE PRESENT town, dating from the 12th-century Crusaders, is actually the third town of its name in the tropical setting, 1,000 feet below sea level. The first and oldest is the Jericho of the Old Testament, whose walls fell at Joshua's approach. It is now marked only by a large mound at the northwest end of the present town.

TV Series Will View Church

Washington (NC)—What is found and what takes place inside a Catholic church will be explained in the inaugural series of "Catholic Hour" television programs.

Entitled "The Church — God's House," the four program series will be carried by 47 National Broadcasting Company TV stations beginning Sunday, January 4, at 1:30 p. m. EST.

Produced by the National Council of Catholic Men, "The Catholic Hour" will not be a simulcast of the radio "Catholic Hour."

Among the subjects to be treated during the series will be the Divine Presence, genuflection, kneeling, statues, the Stations of the Cross, the vestments and vessels, the altar, conduct in Church, and consolations of the Divine Presence.

On hand as guest of honor on the first program will be Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston who will deliver a welcoming message.
