Catholic Students

Parls -- (RNS) -- French Roman Catholic students have been put on an equal footing with those attending colleges for the first time since the separation of Church and State at the beginning of the century.

This has resulted from legislation passed by the Senate which allows students to use universities. The bill previously had been approved by the National Assembly.

The new measure extends a 1951 law which granted State aid to Catholic primary schools in the form of scholarships for needy students. It also provided through church, school or parent associations.

The new legislation is expected to ease the pressure on the already overcrowded State t impossible for many students parents to attend Catholic colleges.






