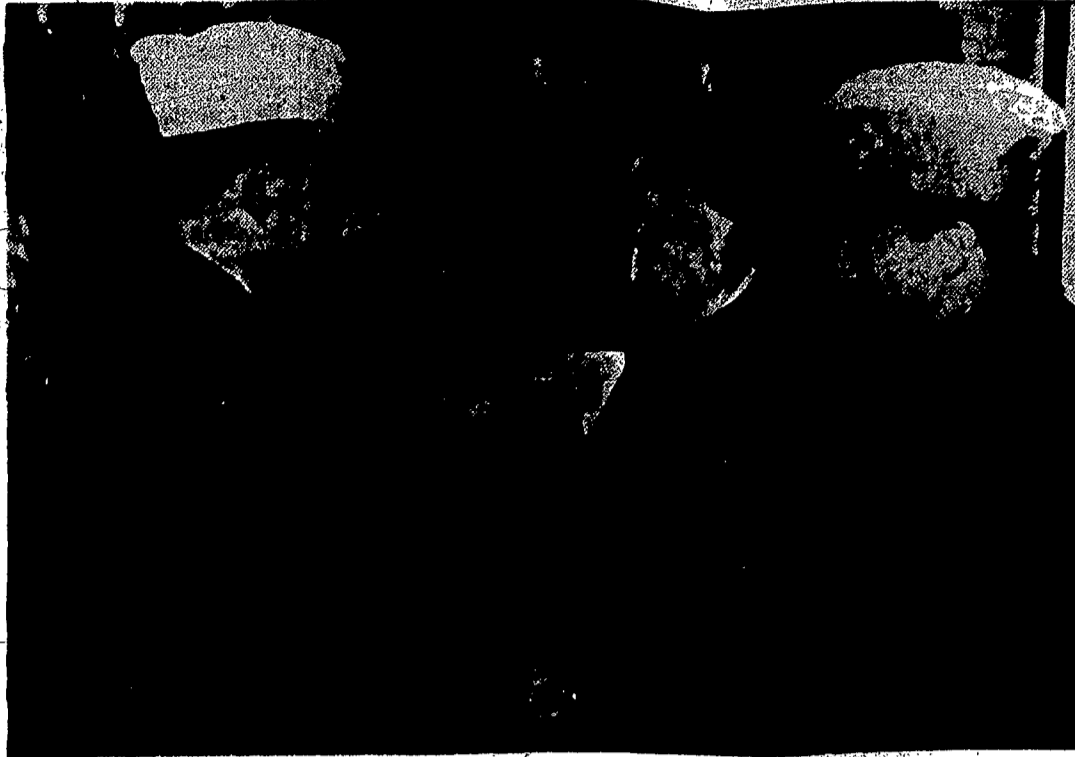
Rochesterian Given ROTC Commission

Sales Record Broken By Genesee In 1952

In a newspaper advertisement published in daily and other newspapers in the territory, the Genesee Brewing Co. Inc. announced that 800,000 barrels of Genesee beer and ale were produced in 1952, based on projected estimates made Dec. 15, 1952.

The advertisement was over the signature of Robert G. Wehle, brewery president.

The advertisement said that the volume represents almost twice that of the next largest brewery in New York State, outside of the metropolitan area.

The present Genesee Brewing Company, established by Louis A. Wehle, now Chairman of the Board, in 1933 has been successful, he said, because of a firm policy of quality control, aggressive advertising and merchandising tactics, and a strong friendly, enthusiastic distributor organization.
