

Role of Modern Catholic Woman Told By Fr. Shamon

Auburn — The Rev. Albert J. Shamon, professor of English at St. Andrew's Seminary was the speaker at the January First Saturday Luncheon of Auburn, Deanery, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, at the Osborne Hotel.

Speaking on "Christian Caravans," Father Shamon reminded his hearers of the Christian temple to Diana the roof of which rested on the heads of heroic figures of women.

The speaker declared that modern Catholic women should play a similar role in upholding our Christian civilization. Father Shamon quoted, as an opening proof of this, the 1945 allocution of Pope Pius XII, "The fate of society, dear women, is in your hands."

MAKING A PRACTICAL application of this includes two things Father Shamon told the Auburn Women. "Be total Catholics; shun sin" he admonished them.

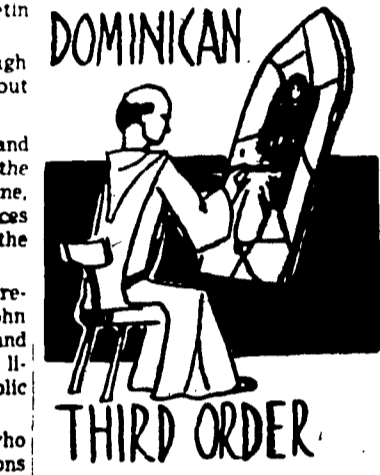
