Holy Family Theatre Sets 'The Robe' For Lenten Play

About 100 members of the Holy Family Theatre of Jay St. met in the Pine Room for their annual Christmas Party on December 26th, 1952. At this time plans for their forthcoming Spring production, "The Robe" were made. "The Robe" is a brand new release, based on the book written ten years ago by Lloyd C. Douglas, a best seller of the same name. It hasn't as yet been adapted by any acting group, amateur or professional, in this part of the country. Several hundred thousand dollars have already been spent by Hollywood, in preparation for the filming of this colossal production, but due to difficulties in the casting of the main characters and actual location, it has temporarily been postponed. The prospective stars are at present on a European tour, Tyrone Power, possibly to do the lead. In the past five years The Holy Family Theatre has built up a tremendous reputation for its stupendous productions both in the dramas and musicals. This year, instead of the usual Spring Musical, The Holy Family Theatre is embarking upon a great new adventure, the production of a religious spectacle, to be presented during Lent, the week of March 15th. Giving a tremendous boom to this "first" in Rochester, will be organ music as background, with Joe Snyder as organist. The stage crew has already prepared the bulk of the scenery, although the finishing touches will be completed in the next week for the nine scenes in this three-act dramatic religious play. Period costumes, depicting the era will highlight the settings beginning with the Crucifixion, and showing scenes in Palestine, Rome and Greece.
