Bulletin Edited At Reformatory Begins 13th Year

Don Isaac Bulletin, "The Only Penal Institution Journal Devoted Wholly to Religious News," enters its 13th year with the Jan. 1, 1935 issue, the 3-column, 4-page publication announced in that issue.

The Bulletin, published semi-monthly here and for the inmates of Elmira Reformatory, was first published on May 29, 1900, to note the 20th anniversary of the Rt. Rev. Francis J. Lane's ordination to the priesthood.

During the continuous publication of the Bulletin for the past 12 years, it has served the Catholic population well, the article states.

PURPOSE of the publication is for instruction (the Question Box and Father Lane Chats columns); for recording the history of the Catholic Church in the Reformatory (news page) and for the opportunity of written expression by the inmates (editorials and Other Voices columns).

In the history of the Bulletin, which was founded two years after the dedication of St. John Bosco Chapel, outstanding events have been recorded.

These include the annual Inaugural Mass, the observance of Father Lane to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Bishop, the founding and growth of Father Lane's Christian organization of prisoners and others who have greatly helped them on parole to succeed.
