

### Riot Protests Prelate Arrest In Poland

London — (RNS) — Polish Catholics rioted at Cracow in protest against the arrest of Archbishop Eugene Baziak. It was reported here.

A number of the demonstrators were killed or wounded when police fired into the crowd, the report said.

WARSAW AUTHORITIES refused to confirm or deny the report, which said that several thousand Poles gathered outside the Cracow cathedral and in neighboring streets when word spread that the archbishop had been arrested.

A large force of police was sent to disperse them. The demonstration turned into a riot when the police began firing into the crowd.

Archbishop Baziak is metropolitan of Lwow, but has been serving as administrator of the Cracow archdiocese since the death, in 1951, of its archbishop, Adam Cardinal Sepieha.

ACCORDING TO the same report Archbishop Baziak has been imprisoned at a spot 60 miles out of Cracow.

Word also was received here that the archbishop had been deported to Russia. The rumor, it was said, touched off further demonstrations by Catholics in towns surrounding the ancient Polish city.

### Protestants Help Monks Fight Fire

London — (NC) — Anglicans, Methodists and Salvation Army members came from their own services to help priests and monks of St. Joseph's Monastery at Stamford rescue valuables when fire swept the historic building.

The monastery — located about 30 miles north of London — is the center of the English Redemptorists.

As firemen went into action a human chain of volunteers passed out to safety the monks' precious library of 11,000 volumes. They also rescued in this way chalices, vestments, movable furnishings, pictures and other property.

### Two Papal Aides Declined Red Hat, Pontiff Reveals

Rome — (RNS) — Two Pro-Secretaries of State for the Vatican who preferred not to become Cardinals prevailed on Pope Pius XII not to elevate them to princely rank, it was disclosed here.

The disclosure was made by the Pope himself in his address to the Consistory at which 24 new Cardinals were created.

Without mentioning names, the Pontiff said he had intended to elevate "two most worthy prelates who are in charge, each in his own section, of the public affairs of the Church."

THE POPE referred to Mgr. Domenico Tardini and Mgr. Giovanni Battista Montini, who jointly administer the Vatican Secretariat of State.

"Their names," said Pope Pius, "were the first we had written when we drew up the list of Cardinals to be created."

"These prelates, however, giving palpable evidence of their virtue, requested us to insistently allow them to decline this very high honor that we thought it fitting to hear their expressed wishes and repeated petitions."

The Pontiff acceded to their request, but he told the Cardinals he still had wanted to honor them with some mark of recognition.

"Therefore, as you know," he said, "we have promoted them to a higher rank of honor which will better and more fully bear testimony to their field of intensive activity."

THE PROMOTIONS referred to were made last December when the Pope announced the names of the 24 prelates picked to become Cardinals. Both Mgr. Tardini and Mgr. Montini were made Pro-Secretaries of State. Previously, Mgr. Tardini had held the title of Secretary for Extraordinary Affairs and Mgr. Montini had been Substitute for Ordinary Affairs.

The two monsignori share the duties of Secretary of State under the supervision of Pope Pius, who was Secretary of State when he was chosen to become Pontiff.

Pope Pius has not appointed anyone to the rank of Secretary. The position normally is held by a Cardinal.

### American College Dedication Slated

Rome — (NC) — The new home of the North American College in Rome will be dedicated October 14. His Holiness Pope Pius XII was told today.

In a private audience Bishop Martin J. O'Connor, rector of the college, spoke with the Pontiff about plans for the new building. The Pope expressed pleasure at the progress being made and extended his blessing to the faculty, students and alumni of the col-
