Talk On Redemption Heard In Auburn Catholic Forum

Auburn — The Rev. Francis P. Donohue, O. Carm., prior of Whitefriars, Auburn was speaker at the Catholic Information Forum Tuesday evening, Jan. 13 in the Osborne Hotel.

Speaking on the topic, "Do we need Redemption?" Father Donohue declared:

"The Redemption was the great work of Christ's priesthood. By freely offering Himself as a victim for sin He made sin work its own ruin in what seemed its greatest victory.

"As we came to grief with Adam, we rise to triumph with Christ. As in Adam all sinned, so in Christ shall all be made to live. (1 Cor. 15:22) Thus we who were involved in a father's sin were reinstated by a Brother's love."

The question and answer period which followed the talk was conducted by the Father Donohue. The Carmelite Fathers have also been using this period to answer questions found in the question box available at the door. These latter questions tend to deal with practical aspects of Christian living.

Mrs. Joseph P. Cuddy, chairman of the Forum series which is sponsored by Auburn Diocese, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women presided. Moderator of the Council, the Rev. Kieran J. Hickey, O. Carm. is director of the information forum.
