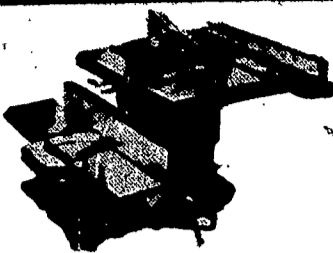

13 Catholic Colleges For Women Plan Exhibits At IFCA Sponsored 'Fair'

Rochester Circle, International Federation of Catholic Alumnae, has scheduled a Fair of Catholic Women's Colleges for Sunday, Feb. 1, at 2 p.m. in Sacred Heart Academy, 8 Prince St., according to Miss Jean Schneider, chairman of the IFCA education committee in charge.

The Fair is designed to acquaint girls of junior and senior classes of the Rochester and area high schools with the educational opportunities offered by colleges affiliated with IFCA, Miss Schneider said.

A DISPLAY of catalogues and pamphlets from 90 Catholic women's colleges is planned. Thirteen colleges will have exhibits. Each college will be represented by an alumna acting as college chairman.

Activities of the group center around the development of interest in the Catholic way of education and in the gathering of data on Catholic educational facilities and on scholarship available in Catholic secondary schools, colleges and universities.
