Loughton approaches his subject matter. Too often the books of the Old Testament, for example, appear to us staid and archaic. Mr. Loughton's ability, however, gives the viewer an impression he is watching something that rivals the World Series for excitement. In these readings, the actor works on a completely empty stage. He has no assistants and props include a stool, the few texts being used, a lectern and his spectacles. RELATING the story of David and Goliath, Loughton lines up the armies of the Philistines with one hand and the Israelites with the other. As Goliath, he swells his enormous chest, raises himself to full height, and bellows like twenty "Bounty" captains. Loughton, as the boy David, rips off his glasses, (his hair conveniently tousling over the forehead), and with the jutting of his lower lip, we see a plucky little Israelite facing the terror of the enemy with supernatural faith. It's all Charles Loughton for a half hour, there's no one else to see or hear, and the complete informality of having the great Loughton read for you in your own living room is a real treat.
