Cardinal Newman
Sainthood Sought

London (RNS) - A move
toward the canonization of John
Henry Cardinal Newman, 19th
century English educator and
Roman Catholic convert, has
been endorsed by Archbishop Joseph
Masterson of Birmingham.

The Catholic Herald here said
that Archbishop Masterson had
sanctioned a prayer to promote
the beatification cause of Cardinal
Newman.

This prayer, which has been
said in many parts of Canada
for some years, "the paper said,
"is being printed with a short
prayer by Cardinal Newman
himself, and the Archbishop has
attached an indulgence of 200
days, which may be gained by
those who say it in the Birming-
ham diocese."

Red Cross Goal
Set At \$571,000

The 1952 Fund Campaign
quota of Rochester Chapter,
American Red Cross, will be
\$571,000. This figure was re-
leased after a meeting of the
Chapter Board of Directors, on
Jan. 21, at Chapter Headquar-
ters, 276 Clinton Avenue South.

The board approved the quota
at the meeting. The local Chap-
ter's goal for the 1952 Campaign
was \$538,000.

The 1953 quota for the Ameri-
can National Red Cross has been
set at \$93,000,000, an increase of
\$8,000,000 over the National 1952
goal of \$85,000,000. Charles S.
Wilcox, Chairman of the local
Red Cross Chapter, explained
the increase as "largely to ex-
pand the Red Cross Defense
blood collection for the produc-
tion of gamma globulin, which
is a temporary protection against
the paralytic effects of polio-
myelitis" and because extra funds
have been added to provide a
Red Cross recreation program
for able-bodied servicemen over-
seas.

Theater Friday evening, Feb. 27

Campaign will extend through
Tuesday, March 17.
