Indianapolis — (RNS) — Rep. Robert H. Menke of Huntington has introduced a bill in the state legislature to permit public school buses to go as much as two miles off their regular routes to deliver children to parochial schools.

The bill provides that if the school is more than two miles from the regular route, parochial school children may be transported to a point on the regular route nearest or most easily accessible to the church school.

Greater Indiana law permits the transportation of parochial children to a school on the regular bus route.

Mr. Menke, a young furniture manufacturer who once was one of Indiana University's greatest basketball stars, is a Methodist. But he represents an area which has one of the state's greatest concentrations of Roman Catholics. He is the first Republican ever elected from the district.
