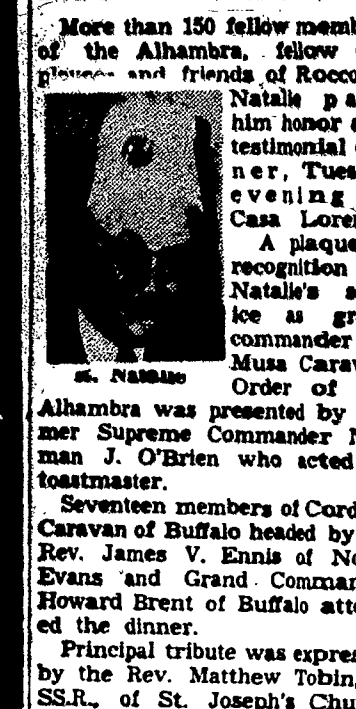

Nazareth College Teacher Explains Education Change

Modern changes in education are the result of increasing complexity of society, Miss Elisabeth Faka told the Women's Community Forum Monday night at the Rochester Chamber of Commerce.

Head of the Nazareth College department of secretarial science and economics, she was a participant in a panel discussing "Responsibility of Women for Education." Her topic was "Our Changing Educational Patterns."

"TRY TO understand," she urged, "that when we teach material you were never taught or leave out material that you were taught, when we try new methods or put new emphasis on old problems, we are attempting to give our children a better and fuller education so that they can meet the problems of tomorrow."

Stressing the need for an educated citizenry, she said that a better understanding of history, civics, government and economics is "vital." "We need to know more about the world and its problems as well as about our own particular part of it," she added.

"We must learn about such things as inflation, unemployment and social security, law, science, banking, income, tax and installment buying."

THE NEED for everyone to understand more about science as it plays an increasingly important role in life, and the need for greater competence in the fundamental tools of reading and writing were also emphasized by Miss Faka.

She summarized the goals of education as physical fitness, economic literacy, social virtue, cultural development, and moral and spiritual development.
