

IFCA Group Arranges Two Catholic Press Exhibits

Catholic Press Month exhibits erected by the Literature Group of the International Federation of Catholic Alumnae attracted many interested visitors to the Catholic Women's Club and Columbus Civic Center.

The IFCA Group attractively displayed samples of Catholic newspapers in the United States and had on hand magazines of all types with reader interest for teen agers and children in kindergarten.

Publications of the general type for those of mature opinion were displayed along with those of mission organizations and other organs of the devotional type.

PAMPHLETS submitted by several of the 25 major publishing houses were in the exhibit as were brochures on Catholic Book Clubs, booklists and book jackets from the publishing houses.

The IFCA Literature Group has two main objectives: 1. To cultivate an awareness of the function of literature in setting forth the philosophy of life; 2. To acquaint the public with the critical value of a Catholic view of life through the medium of the printed word.

The Group's book discussion group is making an analysis of popular books by Catholic authors. Members are sending textbooks and other useful books to a needy parish in Mississippi at Starkville where the Rev. Joseph Martin is starting a parish library.

Consult Road Map Of Life, Jesuit Urges Geneva Women

Geneva—"When you take a trip, you frequently stop to consult a road map, so you will know whether you are on the right road," said the Rev. Thomas O'Day, S.J., at the opening of the women's mission Sunday in St. Stephen's Church.

"During this week, we will consult the map of life to see when we came from and where we are going," he continued.

A RECORD attendance marked the opening of the two week's mission at 4 p.m., Sunday in the church.

Father O'Day and the Rev. Edward Hauga, S.J., are in charge of the mission program. First week is devoted to the women of the parish and second week to the men.

Father O'Day emphasized that man "is made up of body and soul" and not like the animals, who live by instinct and feelings.

Discussing happiness and the measurement of success in life, he said that there are only certain intrinsic values which we can take with us from time to time.

HAPPINESS, HE said cannot be secured through wealth, prestige or high social position in life. As an example of this, he cited several prominent and wealthy men who did not find happiness through material success.

He told of their loss of wealth, some of them dying penniless, others committing suicide. He recalled how a beautiful and wealthy movie actress, who had everything the world could offer, yet who did not find happiness, wound up by taking her own life.

He emphasized that only through God can a man or woman find real happiness in this world and eternal happiness in the next.

Mission Masses this week will be at 6:15 a.m., and 9 a.m. in addition to the regular schedule. Evening services of the mission will be held at 7:45 p.m., and will include recitation of the rosary, instruction, sermon and benediction.

Closing service of the women's mission will be held Sunday in the church.
