

St. Monica Unit To Hear Pastor

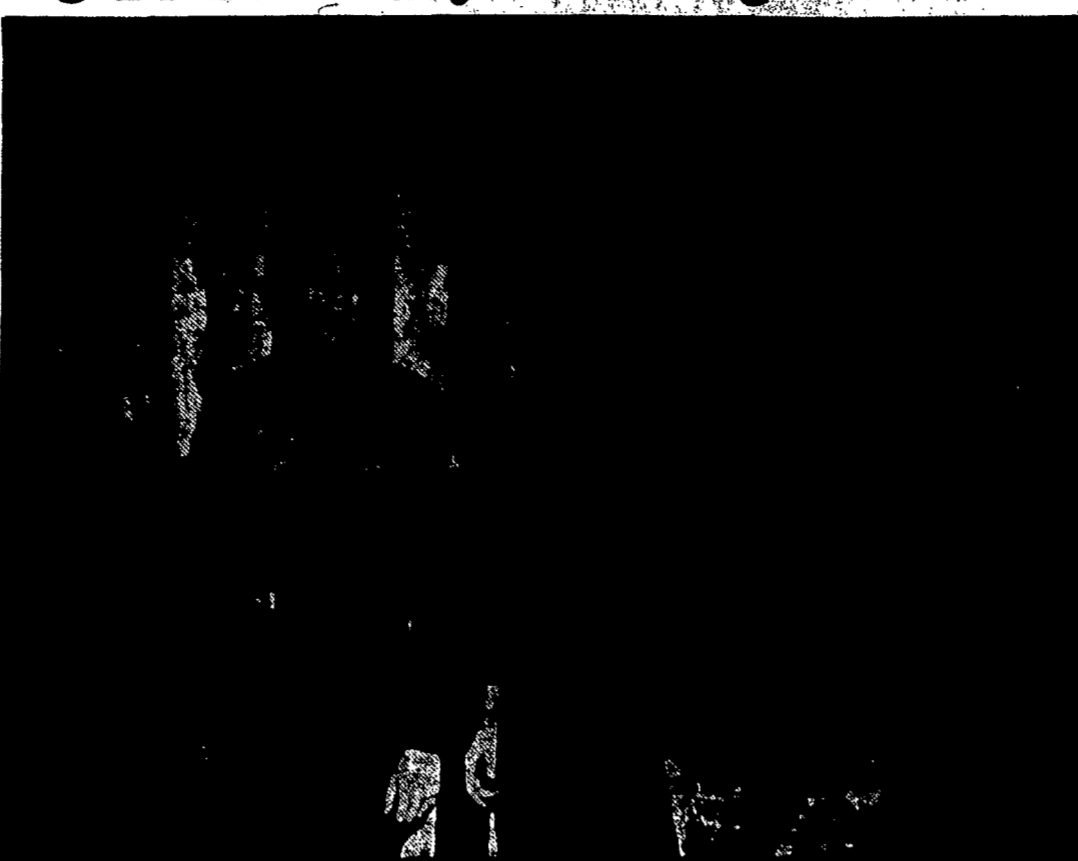
