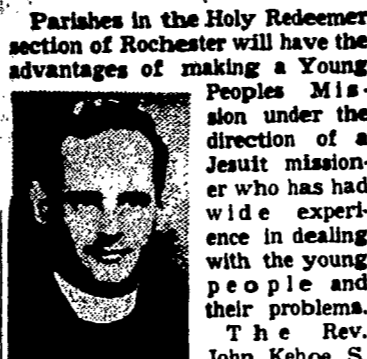

Lay organizations, their meeting dates and officers, take up a large portion of the Directory. Religious Community foundations, chaplains serving public institutions and diocesan cemeteries are listed under special headings.

A Buyers' Guide for easy reference to advertisers was compiled and included in the 1953 Directory.

First page of the directory carries a map of the Diocese of Rochester and statistics on the Diocese of 320,700 Catholic population. The Directory was produced by the Christopher Press, 35 Scio St., Rochester.
