Academic Topic Set In Symposium By Nazareth Girls

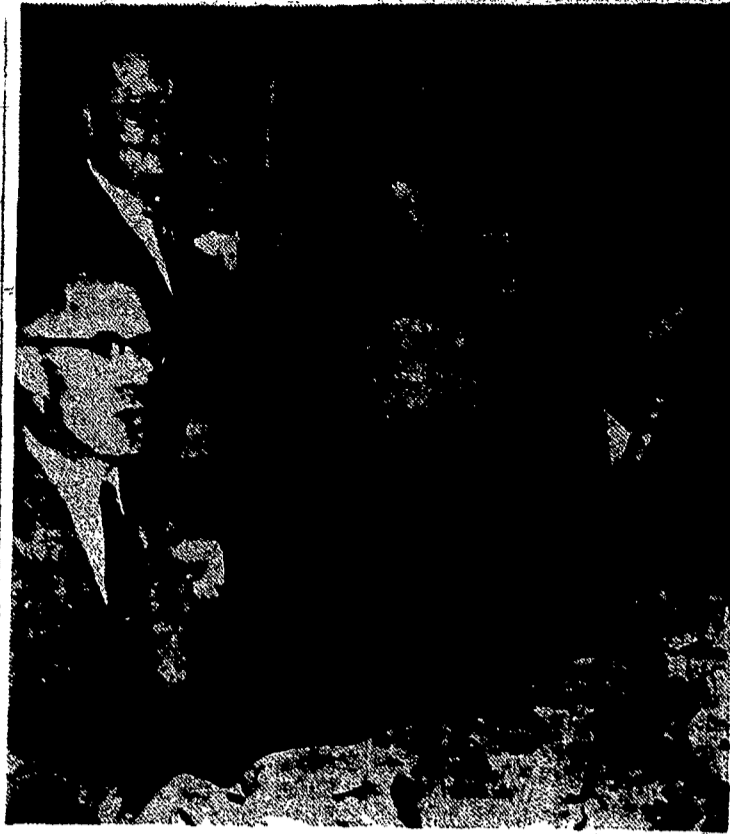

Overflowing the center aisle of St. Joseph's Church, the knights and sons assisted at Mass celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney. The Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Matthew Tobin, C.S.S.R., chaplain of the K. of C. The Fourth Degree uniform unit headed by Faithful Navigator Charles A. Tucker escorted the Bishop.

The "man-saint," St. Joseph, was held up for the knights to emulate by Bishop Kearney. The Bishop urged them to pray to St. Joseph, patron of the Universal Church, for intercession in behalf of the millions of Catholics being persecuted behind the Iron Curtain.
