2 Jesuits Named To Lead Young People's Mission

Names of two additional specially-trained missionaries that he is sending to Rochester to conduct the Young People's Mission during the week of March 22-29 were announced today by the Rev. John Kehoe, S.J., Provincial of the Eastern Province of the Society of Jesus.

Father Kehoe has assigned the Rev. Harvey Haberstroh, S.J., to conduct the mission for the churches in the Sacred Heart section and the Rev. Francis Brock, S.J., for those in the Blessed Sacrament section of the city.

As announced by the Rev. J. Joseph O'Connell, Diocesan Director of the Sodality of Our Lady, a young people's mission for those in their teens or early twenties is being held simultaneously in four churches in the city to care for all the young people in those sections.

Churches are: Sacred Heart Cathedral, Holy Redeemer Church, St. Monica's Church and Blessed Sacrament Church.

FATHER HABERSTROH, S.J., formerly Dean of Men at Fordham University, has had wide experience with young people and their problems. He has taught at Loyola School and St. Francis Xavier High School in New York City. As a missionary, he has given missions and retreats to young people along the entire Eastern seaboard, ranging as far north as Battle Harbor, Labrador.

FATHER BROCK, S.J., a former teacher at Fordham, also has had practical experience in dealing with young people and

their problems. Among other assignments, Father Brock has spent five years at Brooklyn Prep. as Director of Athletics and Prefect of Discipline. At present, he is on the Jesuit Mission Band, conducting missions and retreats for High School and College students.

Father Haberstroh, on a recent visit to Rochester said: "It is my hope that the young people on a city-wide basis is one of the most significant things we have done. While the truths of Christ apply to all age brackets, they are carried on a wave length that has meaning for the particular age group. I am sure that the young people of Rochester will respond enthusiastically to this effort on their behalf."

THE YOUNG people throughout the city, both in Catholic and Public schools are being urged to put aside the week of March 22-29 as reserved exclusively for the mission.

Parishes assigned to the Sacred Heart Section are: Holy Cross, St. Anthony, St. Charles, Precious Blood, St. Patrick, St. George, Our Mother of Sorrows, St. John's, Holy Rosary and Holy Apostles. The parishes in the Blessed Sacrament section are: St. Mary's, St. Boniface, St. Louis, St. John the Evangelist, St. Anne's and Our Lady of Lourdes.

Although the young people may attend the mission in any of the four churches, it is hoped that they will take advantage of the nearness of their prospective mission church.

Father Hickey Awarded Three Citations

Chaplain Bernard L. Hickey, of the Rochester diocese, is among 21 priests who received combat citations for service in Korea, a C.W. News Service dispatch stated this week.

Current listings show that 70 chaplains of all faiths have received a total of 115 citations in Korea. In releasing these figures, the Navy Department noted that "an unusually high percentage of Navy chaplains have received combat citations."

Father Hickey, whose home is in Waverly, received the Presidential Citation, the Letter of Commendation and the Bronze Star.

He was one of the four Navy chaplains with the First Marine Provisional Brigade, first Marine force to land in South Korea.
