### Christian Women Extolled By Fr. Flynn In Auburn

Auburn—The First Saturday Club of Auburn Deaneary, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, heard the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, editor of the Catholic Courier-Journal at the March meeting of the group held in the Hotel Osborne.

Speaking of Christian women of today and yesterday, Father Flynn admonished his hearers. "Live in the modern world but do not be deceived by the modern idea that you are better off because of material advantages.

**THE SPEAKER** paralleled the accomplishments of modern women with Christian heroines down through the ages and said in part: "The record of Christian women can outmatch anything praiseworthy in modern women."

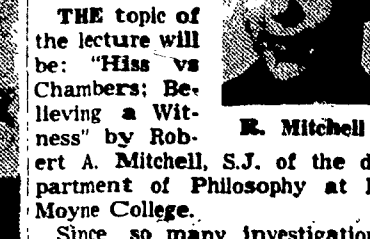

### 'Witness' Topic Set Sunday In LeMoynes Series

Auburn—The LeMoynes Lecture Series which opened last Sunday will continue with the second talk of the series on Sunday, March 15 at 4:00 p.m. in St. Mary's Lyceum Hall here.



**R. Mitchell** is the topic of the lecture which will be "Hiss vs Chambers: Beware a Witness" by Robert A. Mitchell, S.J. of the Department of Philosophy at LeMoynes College.

Since so many investigations are being set in front of the people today and the testimony of a witness is so frequently challenged, the lecturer will establish and explain the principles and norms of judging human testimony.

Using the famous Hiss-Chambers trial as illustration and setting down the conditions and tests required, the lecturer will answer the perplexing question: "When can you know that a man is telling a lie and when can you determine that he is telling the truth?"

**THESE LECTURES** are part of the adult education program offered by the Auburn LeMoynes Council of Catholic Women, Monday, March 16 at 8:15 p.m. in the Knights of Columbus Home, Auburn.

Two Auburn doctors, Robert J. Schafer, M.D. and Frank A. Gracoffo, M.D. will conduct the discussions for the young men and women.

### Francis Status Told By LeMoynes Speaker

Auburn—The LeMoynes Lectures opened Sunday, March 8 in the Lyceum Hall of St. Mary's Church with a talk by the Rev. Aloysius J. Owen, S.J., chairman of the department of Industrial Relations of LeMoynes. James Pitcher, president of the local club, introduced Father Owen who spoke on "Popular Front: Unpopular Spain: Why?"

At the outset of his talk Father Owen warned his audience against the danger of oversimplification pointing out that the temptation to characterize Franco as a saint or a devil seems to present itself to many minds.

Tracing the growth of anarchism and marxian socialism in Spain from the middle of the nineteenth century, the speaker etched the background against which Franco moved to power.

Father Owen declared that Franco is unpopular in certain circles outside of Spain because of a "triple international conspiracy—Masonry, Communism, and the Black Legend" along with the Catholic Church that he represents the forces of reaction, and tyranny.
