

Jesuits Buy 25-Acre Site On Elmwood Ave., Brighton, For McQuaid High School

The Jesuit Fathers have purchased a 25-acre tract in the Town of Brighton, suburb adjacent to Rochester, as the site for the new McQuaid High School for boys. The attractive site, located on the southeast corner of Elmwood Avenue and Clinton Avenue South, was purchased from Attorney Samuel Levy and his wife Anna for the price of \$63,000. Sale negotiations were completed yesterday with Attorney Daniel E. Macken representing the Jesuit Fathers.

Estimated cost of the high school planned for the newly acquired site is \$2,150,000 according to the Rev. Lorenzo K. Reed, S.J., director of high schools of the New York Province of the Society of Jesus. The Diocese of Rochester will contribute \$1,500,000 to

This latter extension connects with the Plymouth South bus line.

Brighton's "Twelve Corners" area is about one and one-third miles to the east of the new high school site.

Father Reed pointed out that construction of the proposed "Outer Loop" will bring the entire city of Rochester within easy reach of the school and make it possible for suburban transit lines and private cars to transport students easily from Fairport, East Rochester, Pittsford, Honeoye Fails, (hill and other towns of Monroe County.

McQUAID High School, named in memory of the Most Reverend Bernard J. McQuaid, first Bishop of Rochester and proneer champion of Catholic education, will be built to provide for 1.000 students and include residence facilities for the Jesuit Fathers who will staff the school. Records produced during yes-

terday's final negotiations for the McQuaid High School site revealed that original ownership of the Brighton tract dated back to 1885 when the property was held by Joseph LeFrois.
