**2 Priests To Serve With Msgr. Burns**

Very Rev. Msgr. Frederick W. Freking, chancellor of the Diocese of Winona, Minn., has been appointed spiritual director of the North American College in Rome according to Bishop Martin J. O'Connor, College rector.

In that post Monsignor Freking will be associated with the Very Rev. Richard K. Burns, priest of the Rochester Diocese who is vice rector of the College.

Named as assistant vice rector was the Rev. George A. Schlichte, of the Archdiocese of Boston. He will serve under Monsignor Burns. Both Monsignor Freking and Father Schlichte are graduates of the college. An Annapolis graduate, Father Schlichte is the first World War II graduate.

In his capacity as spiritual director, Monsignor Freking will have distinguished predecessors known in Rochester.  
Former spiritual directors included His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney, fourth Bishop of Rochester and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles E. Fitzgerald, a visitor to his relatives here in Rochester on several occasions.
