T is hard to believe that the Civil War in the United States is in the old Mercy Motherhouse still effecting our Missions in Africa, but that is the truth. Most on South Street. She pronounced of the slaves that were sold in the Southern States came from her final vows in 1904. Africa. Those who were taken from the West were dragged through the hot sands of the Sahara. Even to this day the caravan' routes are strewn with the white bones of men with black skin who were being sold by white men with black souls. Other slave caravans which came from the East and Central Africa headed toward Zanzibar. The Moslems sometimes met these slave caravans and promised them exemption from slavery if they became followers of Mohammed. Many did in order to save their lives.

Naturally those who were "converted" to Moslemism returned to their native lands and became spreaders of Moslemism. This accounts for some Africans being Moslem today. The prospects are not too bright today for the Missions. Black Africa has a population of 130,000,000. Out of this number, 13,000,000 are Catholics and over 28,000,000 are Moslems. In other words, the Moslema number about 22% of the population and Catholics about 10%.

Looking back over a period of 20 years, despite our missionary efforts, we have not kept pace with the growth of the Moslems. In that period of time, the Moslems increased 9% and the Catholics only 4%. This means the Moslems are converting the natives of Africa twice as fast to Mohammed as we are to Christ.

There are some reasons for this. Every Moslem merchant is dressed 45 members of Geneva a missionary, but not every Catholic is a missionary. There is something we can do about this, and that is become vicarious missionaries in Africa by sacrificing some of our substance to help spread tthe faith and belief in Our Lord and His Blessed Mother, Giving alone is not enough, because in giving we part with only a thing; in sacrificing we give a part of ourselves. And every bit of our heart that goes to Africa out of love for souls helps Africa more than a bit of what we gave from our pocket alone. Africa is full of souls and each of them is as important to the Saviour as the souls in London or New York. To redeem them in union with the Cross, we have to have a cross in our lives and that is what we mean by sacrifice.
