

### Bishop Tells Nuns Example Is Vocation Inspiration

His Excellency Bishop Kearney at the close of a Solemn Pontifical Mass marking St. Joseph's Day, March 19 in Nazareth Motherhouse, Pittsford said that a young person is drawn to a religious order because of the personification in some individual Sister of the ideals of that Order.

"So we ask God in His gracious Providence, through the intercession of St. Joseph, that because of your example and your courage and your inspiration, we will always have available the Sisters to carry out the magnificent tradition of almost a century, which is the story of the Sisters of St. Joseph in this diocese," His Excellency said.

The Bishop noted that "we all love the recurring feast of St. Joseph not only as an opportunity to renew our devotion to the Foster Father of our Divine Lord, but on this particular occasion to join with you in your prayers of thanksgiving to the patron saint of this Community for the many blessings that have come to your Order during the past year."

"At the same time," the Bishop continued, "we go to him the tribute of love and devotion which must be in the heart of every one who has consecrated her life to the service of God under the special protection and guidance of this great Saint."

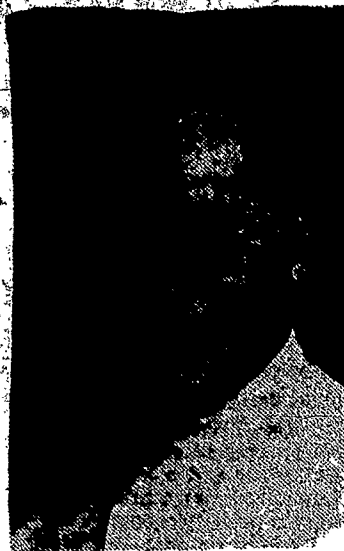

### Ex-Rochesterian Named Superior In C.C.S.S. Order

FATHER LANE is the son of the late Arthur H. and Mae Kingsbury Lane and the nephew of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J. Lane, Catholic Chaplain at Elmira Reformatory.

He entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts in 1937 and was ordained in 1942. Since 1951 he has been pastor of St. Matthew's Church, Mt. Gleason, O.

The Fathers of the Sacred Hearts are in charge of Our Lady of Victory on Pleasant St. here in Rochester.

### German Clergy Aid Asked Of Priests

Archiebishops of the Diocese of Rochester were asked to assist priests in Soviet Germany by His Excellency Bishop Kearney in a letter responding to an appeal from the Rev. Wilson E. Kaiser in charge of Catholic relief work in Germany.

Father Kaiser, a priest of Great Falls, Montana diocese, and son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward W. Kaiser, 400 Eaton Road, Irondequoit is representative of the National Catholic Welfare Conference-War Relief Services with headquarters in Berlin. He has been there since 1949.

Financial aid and clothing for priests were asked for the 1400 diocesan and religious priests in that area.

BREAKFAST arrangements are being handled by Mary Ann Morreale, a Senior and Christine Russo, a Junior at East Rochester High.

Both of these young women go to an earlier Mass and afterwards prepare coffee and cocoa for the other students.

Breakfast finances and promotion are being handled by Michael Yacono, a Junior at East Rochester. He has had charge of purchasing supplies and has taken care of the necessary details that are involved in a project of this kind.

"Interest has been high—whoever saw so many young people get up so early? And attendance at daily Mass has increased in the parish. A few people have admitted that they came to see if it were true that so many young people were going to Mass and Communion every day," a spokesman said.

"The boys" are grateful to the Women's Sodality of St. Jerome's and also the Young Ladies Society.
