

### Degrees To Be Conferred At Assumption

Assumption College, located at Watkins, Ontario, has the alma mater of many Rochester men, has been granted permission by the Dominion Legislature to confer its own university degrees. Since 1919, Assumption has been affiliated with the University of Western Ontario, London, Ont., through which university Assumption students received their degrees.

AS A RESULT of the new legislation, the Most Rev. John C. Cody, D.D., Bishop of London, Ont., becomes chancellor of the college.

The Very Rev. E. C. LeBel, C.S.B., President of Assumption College, said: "We deeply appreciate the high honor that has come to us by the action of the Ontario Legislature in giving Assumption College the right to confer university degrees in all branches of learning."

"The province in its wisdom has jealously guarded this degree-conferring power and therefore by extending it to Assumption has given this institution a rare mark of confidence. We call upon friends and alumni to assist us to fulfill our added responsibility in the field of higher education."

Assumption College was founded in 1857 by the Basilian Fathers, the same religious order which staffs St. John Fisher Col-

lege and Aquinas Institute in Rochester.

### Varied Religious Activities At Cenacle Spur Large Group In Planning Benefit

Fourth annual card party for the benefit of the Convent of Our Lady of the Retreat in the Cenacle has been planned for Thursday after Easter, April 9 at 8 p.m. in Columbus Civic Center Auditorium. The benefit is being sponsored by a large committee comprised of members of the various guilds and study clubs of the Cenacle, with Mrs. Elmer O'Brien and Mrs. Edward Zimmer as Co-Chairmen to assist the Honorary Chairman, His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

Because the Cenacle fulfills the spiritual needs of so many in the Rochester area, the task of sponsoring a big fund raising event is willingly shouldered by a large committee of women, to help support the activities of the Cenacle House of Retreats.

During the past year more than 2800 women and girls from the Rochester area have either made retreats or days of recollection at the Cenacle.

Each month. Once a month in the afternoon there are meetings of Our Lady's Guild for the High School girls. Teachers and professional women meet together in the evenings for lectures and religious exercises.

One of their charitable works is to make possible retreats for women and school girls less able financially to pay their own expenses. These women belong to what is known as St. Raphael's Guild. Telephone workers have the St. Gabriel's Guild; the young business girls meet the fourth Wednesday each month as the Blessed Couder Guild; industrial workers meet the first Wednesday as the St. Regis Guild; and business women meet the second Wednesday of each month in the guild dedicated to Our Lady of the Cenacle. These guilds carry out an interesting work in the Cenacle work in adult education in Christian Doctrine.

Even the tiny tots are brought in by their mothers to learn Christian Doctrine taught in nursery rhyme style while their mothers group together in an afternoon study club.

THEY WILL also be assisted by a group of girls from each of the Catholic High Schools in the city headed up by Miss Irene Winans from the Sacred Heart Convent, Miss Ellen Ward from Mercy High School, Miss Ann Prendergast from Nazareth Academy and Miss Rosemary O'Brien from St. Agnes High School.

The Cenacle Convent is ideally located on East Avenue at the corner of Oxford Street in the former home of Mrs. Nora Conway Todd, Mrs. Todd willed the beautifully appointed home to the Catholic Diocese of Rochester and in 1948 the Religious of the Cenacle were asked by Bishop Kearney to open a Retreat House in Rochester.

With its flowering shrubs, so beautiful in the early spring and summer, its well equipped library and its unique little chapel, it is a perfect place for a retreat house for women of all ages, the committee said.
